

Dear Mayor:

At the end of 1972 I was privileged to be able to inform our citizens that the number of serious crimes reported in Providence had dropped 13.4% below the 1971 rate and, moreover, that our city was fortunate enough to be one of eighty in the United States experiencing a crime decrease that year. It is even more gratifying for me now to be able to report an 8.4% reduction for 1973 in comparison with 1972. Not many cities in the country matched this 21.8% crime decrease over this two-year period.

I can understand how hard it must be for some people to read these figures and fully appreciate them while at the same time having to read or hear about some assault, handbag snatch or robbery having been committed somewhere in Providence. To them I can only say that nowhere on this planet is there any large society in which the daily reality of crime or its potential is non-existent.

If it is true that no community can really achieve anything near a zero crime rate, then police and other components in our criminal justice system can only strive their utmost to push back the forces of crime, to remove the causative factors of crime, and to try and reduce the desire or opportunity of individuals to commit crime or disorder. At the same time, we must also try to reduce the fears some people have about becoming the victims of criminality. These goals are far more important than crime statistics alone, but I do think that figures which show a holding of the line on crime rates or reversals of any rising trend as occurred in Providence over the past two years are positive indicators of strides toward these goals and do signify police capability.

At the beginning of 1973 I established certain objectives and goals for this department along with action programs for their attainment. I was kept informed and followed the course of this activity during my illness until I was able to return to full duty. Almost all of these objectives and goals were reached.

1973 was an important year for the Providence Police Department for many reasons. It marked the first full year of the "new look" of our uniforms and police cars. Limited space prevents me from detailing all of the many


favorable comments received at this office and by our members from private citizens, public officials, other police officers in the state, and from people outside Rhode Island wherever our personnel have appeared in uniform for some special function.


As you know, organizational efficiency depends largely on the adequacy of the training made available to personnel. This is especially true when the organization is a police department and the people to be trained are recruits. Young men and women enter police academies with varying degrees of knowledge, skills and abilities. It is the responsibility of the department to bring them up to a predetermined level of police knowledge and skill. With the help of local, state and federal government resources made available to us in 1973, we were able to refurbish our training academy and design and implement a new basic training program which I consider to be a model for this kind of police training.

The energies of our 1973 action programs were carried into this year when new emphasis is being placed on tactics for combating street crimes which continue to have top priority for the deployment of the manpower and equipment resources of this department.

Whatever achievements we had in 1973 and whatever is being accomplished today in 1974 in preventing, detecting, and suppressing crime is due in no small measure to your personal interest and assistance and to the support received from your administration, from agencies of the state and federal governments, and from many private citizens. The men and women of the Providence Police Department have proven themselves to be worthy of this support without which we could not possibly carry out our vital public safety responsibilities.





CLEARANCE OF PART I OFFENSES REPORTED TO THE POLICE











PROVIDENCE POPULATION BY AGE GROUPS\*




PERSONS ARRESTED FOR PART I OFFENSES
