

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 323

Approved June 8, 1981

RESOLVED, That sodium vapor luminaires be installed within the rights-of-way of the Downtown Ring Road, as shown on the map attached hereto; restricting said sodium vapor luminaires from the adjacent streets of the Ring Road so as to heighten the effect of the Ring Road lighting; and requiring that the installation be phased as determined by the Providence Redevelopment Agency, with the first phase to be on Friendship Street between Richmond and Dorrance Streets.

The Interim Downtown Providence Master Plan for 1985 includes a ring road that utilizes, in large, the existing one-way street system which encircles the downtown area.

The objective of the proposed ring road is to discourage the use of through traffic on downtown streets. To achieve that objective, it is proposed that the installation of sodium vapor luminaires be phased through the Providence Redevelopment Agency in coordination with its downtown projects.

Accordingly, the attached proposed City Council Resolution was prepared at the direction of the Providence Redevelopment Agency and is presented herewith for early introduction to the City Council.


