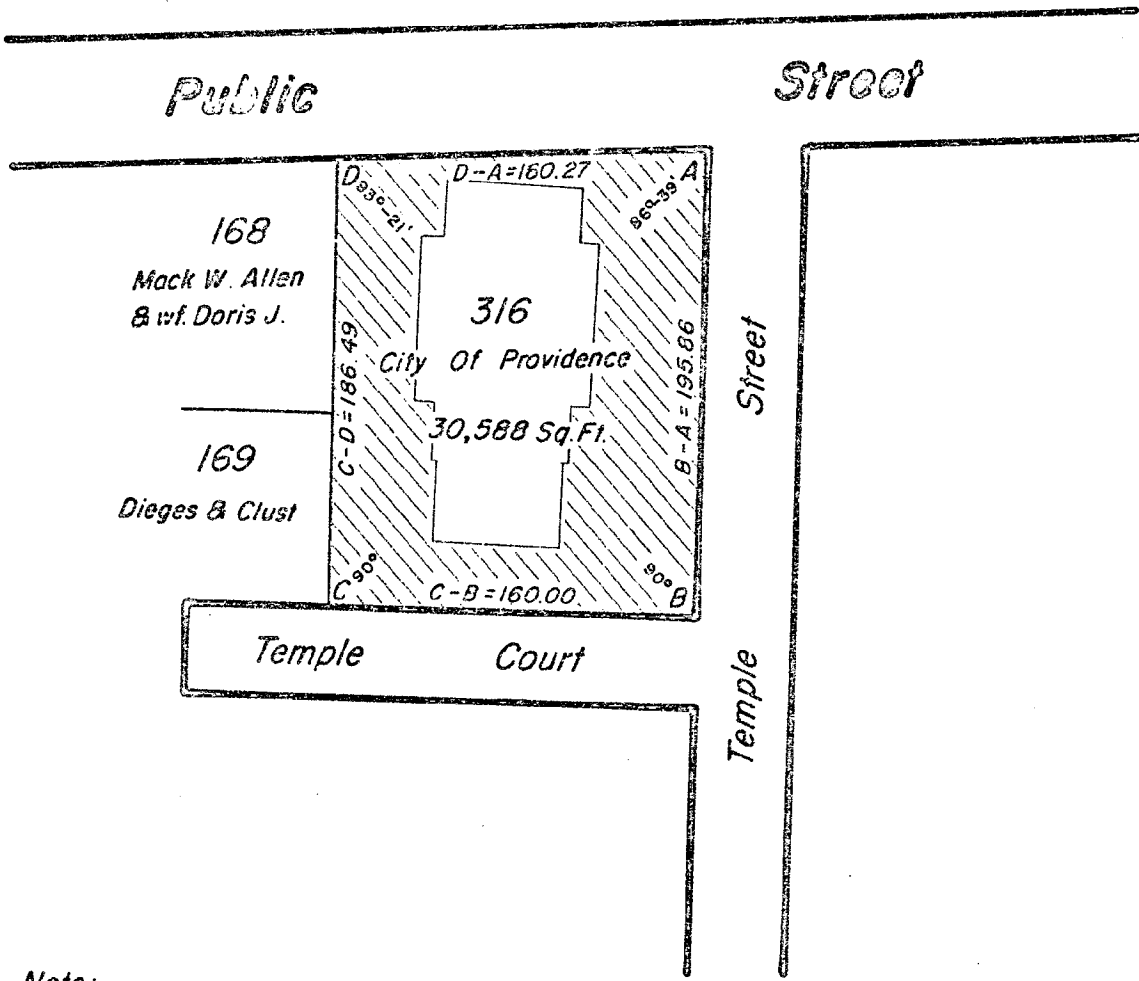

Approved March 10, 1972

WHEREAS, the Very Reverend Flaminio Parenti, C. S., late Pastor Emeritus of Holy Ghost Church in Providence has, by the will of Almighty God, been called to his reward of eternal rest, and

WHEREAS, Father Parenti, from the day of his ordination on September 19, 1908 until his passing on February 27, 1972, served his Church in a most progressive and unselfish manner, starting with his arrival in America in May 1909, from the Rectorship of the College of Missionaries of San Carlo, Boromeo in Italy, his first church; assignment at the church of the Madonna of Pompeii, in the City of New York until 1920; as Acting Pastor of Saint Michael's Church in New Haven, Connecticut; as Pastor of Saint Bartholomew's in Providence and his forty two years of a memorable Pastorate at The Church of the Holy Ghost, the first Church in the oldest Italo-American Parish in Rhode Island, and

WHEREAS, one of the foremost contributions during his lifetime was his assistance in the founding of the Bishop Scalabrini Home for the Aged, located in North Kingstown, Rhode Island, and

WHEREAS, beloved by the multitude of the parishioners within the Federal Hill Area, Father Parenti enjoyed excellent rapport with many of his faith and of other faiths, due largely to his humility and his respect for Holy Mother Church,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That His Honor Mayor Joseph A. Doorley, Jr., the City Council and the several City Officials and Employees in noting the passing of the Very Reverend Flaminio Parenti, C. S. late Pastor Emeritus of Holy Ghost Church in Providence do hereby offer their respective prayers for the eternal repose of his Soul, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Clerk is directed to transmit a duly engrossed copy of this Resolution to the Pastor of the Holy Ghost Church in Providence.





In complying with the ordinances of the City of Providence, the Board of Park Commissioners present the following report of the North Burial Ground for the year 1971.

During the year 1971, the sum of \$3,565.00 was received for Perpetual Care of Lots and Single Graves.

During the year 1971 there were 359 interments making a total of 64,765 since 1848, that being the first year that records of interments were kept.

151 foundations for headstones or monuments were built.

There were 33 Lots placed under Perpetual Care and 52 Single Graves placed under Perpetual Care.

The present number of Lots under Annual Care, 11.

Number of Lots now held in Perpetual Trust, 317.

The average number of employees during the year was 14.



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


