# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 621

Approved July 12, 1975

WHEREAS, under 45-5-12 of the Rhode Island General Laws the City Council is authorized to take possession of neglected burial grounds; and

WHEREAS, Locust Grove Cemetary located in the City of Providence is neglected, in a state of general disrepair, is subject to constant vandalism, and is a hazard to the welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Locust Grove Cemetary Association, the present owner of Locust Grove Cemetary is desirous of transferring the cemetary and all funds in their possession to the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE:

1. That the Mayor, on behalf of the City is authorized to accept title to Locust Grove Cemetary from the Locust Grove Cemetary Association;
2. That the Locust Grove Cemetary will be subject to care and maintenance of the ~~Commissioners of North Burial Ground~~ **BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS** *b.b.*
3. That the City Council will take and manage in trust the funds now in the possession of the ~~Locust~~ **LOCUST** Grove Cemetary Association and the commissioners of North Burial Ground are hereby authorized to draw upon the principal and interest of said funds for the purpose of maintaining and improving said cemetary. *b.b.*
4. That this resolution shall take effect immediately.



Dear Councilman,

This letter is to notify you of the urgency of resolving the Locust Grove Cemetery issue at this time.

A resolution was introduced to City Council on 6/24 to the effect that the city of Providence take title to the cemetery. This bill was referred to the Public Welfare Committee.

It is essential that this bill be sent out of committee and passed for the Mayor's signature by the July 3rd City Council meeting, so that our schedule for refurbishment of the cemetery be no further delayed. Any delay in passage of the resolution may mean that we will not be able to get the \$10,000 endowment fund to be used to obtain tools and materials in time to prepare the cemetery for a Fall planting and landscaping.

In passing the resolution there will be no cost to the city. If anything, it will add revenue as property values rise in that area. Visitors to the city will be able to stroll in the historic graveyard, and an added green space will benefit both our neighborhood and the city as a whole, as well as honor the veterans who are buried there.
