





SUBJECT: Resolution requesting the Traffic Engineer to cause the installation of a "Three-Way" Stop sign on Enfield Street and Walton Street.

The DPW – Division of Traffic Engineering has investigated the request for a 3-WAY STOP on Enfield Street and Walton Street and out of all the possible warrants for stop sign applications, the only warrant that this request can be considered for review is the accident history.

Based on a review the accident history, this intersection does not qualify for a 3-WAY STOP according to the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices. The installation of a 3-WAY STOP at this intersection is not justified nor warranted. Traffic Engineering did add a STOP sign for traffic traveling west on Walton Street at Enfield Avenue.
