## **Bus Routes Affected**

### **Woonsocket**

All service discontinued on North Main Street line.

All night, Sunday and holiday service, except shopping nights, eliminated—but not including the Providence-Woonsocket route.

Service on Woonsocket-Pawtucket route to continue on modified headways. (Headway is time allowed between runs.)

### **Pawtucket**

All service on Roosevelt-East Avenue line discontinued, except for trips to manufacturing plants.

Prospect Hill line discontinued, except that on weekdays and Saturdays only certain trips will be run to Prospect Hill by extending the Broad-John Street route. These trips will not run nights, Sundays or holidays.

Service on Phillipsdale-Red Bridge line will be abandoned beyond Beverage Hill Avenue at New Road.

### **Providence, Cranston, East Providence**

Brook-Brown Street line will be eliminated.

Eddy-Olneyville crosstown line will be eliminated.

Ocean Street line will be eliminated.

Park Avenue crosstown line, except for school trips, will be eliminated in Cranston.

Pontiac connection, except for three morning and three evening rush-hour trips, will be eliminated.

Camp Street line service eliminated between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m., and after 6 at night; no service on Sundays or holidays.

Admiral Street and Branch Avenue line will be consolidated. No service on Branch Avenue between North Main and Hawkins Streets. Admiral Street line discontinued beyond Eagle Park.

Dexter Street-Cranston Street lines will be consolidated, except for trips to mills on Dexter Street between Cranston and Calhoun Avenue, which will be retained.

Governor Street and Taunton Avenue lines will be consolidated. Service on Governor Street line eliminated from Williams Street to Red Bridge; service on Taunton Avenue line beyond County Street, near Six Corners, will be discontinued.

# Governor St. Bus Service End Opposed

Councilman John Ferreira (D-Ward 1) said today that he will ask the state Public Utilities Administration to reconsider its decision to allow the United Transit Co. to eliminate service on the Governor Street line between Williams Street and Red Bridge.

Consolidation of the Governor Street and Taunton Avenue lines was part of a large-scale cut-back of bus service in Woonsocket, Pawtucket, Providence and Cranston granted the UTC yesterday by George W. Michael, public utility administrator.

## To Ask Council Act

Mr. Ferreira said he and his board colleague, Councilman John A. Powers Jr., will ask the City Council tomorrow night to pass a resolution asking that the Williams Street to Red Bridge service be restored.

The councilman said he has been deluged with calls from persons living in the Pitman Street area who will have to walk "four or five blocks" to either Angell Street or Williams Street to catch a bus.

Mr. Ferreira said the neighborhood abounds with apartment houses, nursing and convalescent homes, doctors' offices and elderly people.

## Relief Suggested

He said that he and Rep. Sylvester Perry (D-Providence) met last Friday with Mr. Michael and George A. McLaughlin, deputy public utility administrator who heard the UTC appeal for service cutbacks.

Mr. Ferreira said he and Mr. Perry suggested to the state utility officials that the situation could be corrected by routing either the Rumford or Six Corners buses through Governor Street to cover the half-mile run between Williams Street and Red Bridge.

The councilman said he had hope that an arrangement could be made since Mr. Michael had said the entire UTC fare and service cutback case is still to see how it works out.

About 20 years ago he rented space in Grant's Hobby Shop on Empire Street and had engaged in the stamp business since. Mr. Kilton was elected president of the Philatelic Society in 1941, and since then had been secretary of the society.
