We, whose signatures appear below, are all registered voters of the City of Providence, Rhode Island. We all live on streets contiguous with the Nathan Bishop Middle School. We deplore the inability and unwillingness of those individuals responsible for the maintenance of the school grounds to preserve the beauty and cleanliness of the area by removing broken glass, used beer containers, old lemonade cups, and torn sweat shirts from the grounds of the school. While we note that the area has recently been mowed, we would point out that this was the first lawn mowing that has occurred this year, although we have all been cutting the grass in the area for a period of six weeks or more.

We feel that a regular, systematic, and conscientious program of ground's maintenance would return the whole area to the state of cleanliness that we, as homeowners, have a right to expect. We would suggest that trash containers be placed at appropriate intervals around the tennis courts, if we could be assured that the appropriate authorities would see that they are emptied at specific intervals.

Subject: Grounds Maintenance - Nathan Bishop Middle School

Reference letter from Richard M. Cowett, M. D. to Councilman Thomas W. Pearlman dated 25 June 1974.

It should be noted that Dr. Cowett's letter was dated 25 June 1974. Since that time the grounds at Nathan Bishop Middle School have undergone two complete mowings with incidental removal of cans, papers, bottles and other debris. During the latter maintenance cycle accomplished on Tuesday through Thursday (July 9th through 11th) the entire grounds were given a thorough landscaping job.

This included sweeping of walks, removal of incidental brush, cleaning of concrete drainage ditches, trimming along curbing, trimming of shrubbery and installation of galvanized trash cans within the tennis court areas.

By mid afternoon of Thursday, July 11th, the grounds in their entirety were in excellent shape.

For added information, for whatever it is worth, I had a neighbor approach me and ask me "Who is doing the fine job". I informed him that the work was being done by the School Department and youth corp personnel. He told me that he had lived many years in the area and had never seen the grounds in such fine shape. He further stated that he was going home immediately to call the Providence Journal, a radio and perhaps a T. V. station with a request they visit the area and see for themselves the work that had been done.
