RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 332

Approved April 11, 1979

WHEREAS, Last session, Congress failed to re-enact Countercyclical Fiscal Assistance for fiscal year, 1979, and

WHEREAS, The City of Providence will be forced to reduce services to be financed with those Countercyclical Fiscal Assistance Funds and may ultimately eliminate services which were previously financed with those funds, and

WHEREAS, Last session's Senate-passed bill to renew Countercyclical Fiscal Assistance is pending in the House (H.R. 1246) and the Senate (S. 200), and

WHEREAS, The Senate-passed bill generally provides aid to all local governments with at least Six Percent (6%) unemployment, and

WHEREAS, The unemployment rate in the City of Providence has been consistently above Six Percent (6%), and

WHEREAS, Countercyclical Fiscal Assistance is urgently needed in cities with high unemployment and will be needed in many more cities if an economic downturn occurs later this year or in 1980,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the City of Providence urges the Members of the Rhode Island Congressional Delegation to support enactment of Countercyclical Fiscal Assistance Legislation, in time for the City of Providence to plan their fiscal year, 1980.
