RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 284

Effective: APPROVED April 30, 1984

WHEREAS, it is of utmost importance that City employees and City departments operate in accordance with applicable laws and maintain high standards and integrity and honesty; and

WHEREAS, there have been numerous rumors, reports and charges that certain employees of the City of Providence have engaged in and may continue to engage in violations of applicable law including, without limitation, requirements for performance of services as an employee of the City of Providence; and

WHEREAS, it is important that public confidence in the operations of Providence's city government be restored and maintained; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. That the Chief of Providence Police Department is hereby requested to conduct a full-scale investigation of the operations of the Department of Public Works, the Mayor's Office of Community Development, the Water Supply Board, the Department of Planning and Urban Development and the Department of Public Property, and of the conduct, performance of employees of said departments, with particular regard to said operations and conduct prior to the date on which the existing Director of Public Works commenced his tenure as Director.
