Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained By the City of Providence:

Section 1. To defray the expenses of the City of Providence for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984, the sums of money or so much thereof, as are authorized by law, indicated in the accompanying schedule, are hereby appropriated for the objects and purposes, and in amounts expressed therein provided that payments thereunder shall be subject to the provisions of the Home Rule Charter of 1980, validated by the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island at its January Session, A.D., 1981 and approved November 4, 1980, and subject to the provisions of the City Ordinances relative to the expenditures of money from the City Treasury. Title I Revenue Sharing, Fiscal Assistance to State and Local Government rules and regula-tions shall govern the portion of this Budget so designated.

Sec. 2. All moneys appropriated are to be expended under the direction of the respective department heads unless otherwise provided subject to the approval of the Director of Finance. Pursuant to the authority and provision of Section

810 of the City Charter, entitled "Transfer of Appropriations," the ceiling as to transfers by the mayor of a portion of any unencumbered item of appropriation to another item of appropriation, either within a single department, office or agency of the City, or between two (2) or more such departments, offices or agencies (except appropriations for payments to the sinking fund, City debt, or retirement fund), is hereby altered and increased to ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS. All moneys specifically earmarked with Federal Revenue Sharing Funds shall be so provided unless amended. Any unused Federal Revenue Sharing moneys not appropriated or not used shall not revert to surplus; but shall be reappropriated in the following fiscal year.

Sec. 3. The payments to the School Fund of the following estimated receipts included in the appropriation of \$63,059,000.00 for the support of the Public Schools for the City of Providence fiscal period 1983-1984, will be increased or decreased to conform with the actual amounts received from such sources during the City of Providence fiscal year 1983-1984.

Section 1. The aforescribed Compensation Plan is hereby adopted for all City officers and employees and shall be applied to each, except as hereinafter described.

In order to provide for periodic increases each position is categorized as one (1) of thirty-five (35) "Pay Grades," each of which contains five (5) steps.

Sec. 2. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this ordinance, any and all employees in the Office of the Mayor shall be excepted from any salary established herein so long as the total of the compensation for such employees does not exceed the annual budget appropriation for personal services in the Office of the Mayor.

Sec. 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance the compensation for department heads and legal assistants to the City Solicitor shall be no greater than those herein specified; however, any department head or legal assistant to the City Solicitor may be compensated at a rate lower than that established herein and that lower compensation shall be allowed by this ordinance.

Sec. 4. The provisions of this ordinance shall be retroactive to July 1, 1983.

Sec. 5. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

The motion for Passage the Second Time, as Amended, is Sustained.

The following Ordinance was in City Council June 28, 1983, Read and Passed the First Time and is Returned for Passage the Second Time:

An Ordinance Providing for the Assessment and Collection of 1983 Taxes in a Sum Not Less than Ninety-Eight Million Dollars (\$98,000,000.00) and Not More than One Hundred One Million Dollars (\$101,000,000.00) being based on One Hundred Per Cent (100%) of the 1983-1984 Fiscal Year Tax Collection.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. The City Council of the City of Providence hereby orders the assessment and collection of a tax on the ratable real estate and tangible personal property as well as orders the assessment and collection of an excise tax on all registered motor vehicles, in a sum not less than Ninety-Eight Million Dollars (\$98,000,000.00) and not more than One Hundred One Million Dollars (\$101,000,000.00) being based on One Hundred Percent (100%) of the 1983-1984 Fiscal Year tax collection, as amended; said tax is for ordinary expense charges for the payment of interest and indebtedness in whole or in part of said City and for other purposes authorized by law.

Section 2. The City Assessor shall assess and apportion said tax on inhabitants and ratable real estate and tangible personal property of said City as of the 31st day of December, A.D. 1982 at midnight, Eastern Standard Time, as well as assess and apportion said excise tax on the owners of registered motor vehicles in the City of Providence during calendar year 1982, according to law, and shall on completion of said assessment, date and sign the same, and shall make out and certify to the City Collector of the City of Providence on or before the 15th day of June, A.D. 1983, a complete list containing (1) the name of persons taxed and the total value of all the real estate taxed to each person, (2) the amount of personal estate except manufacturers' machinery and equipment assessed against each person (3) the amount of manufacturers' machinery and equipment, (4) the amount of the motor vehicle

excise assessment against each person, and (5) the total amount of tax assessed against each person on said real estate, personal estate and motor vehicle opposite the name of the person or persons assessed.

The assessment of real estate, personal estate and manufacturers' machinery and equipment shall appear in separate columns in said list. The assessment of motor vehicles shall appear on a separate list.

Said taxes shall be due and payable on and between the 1st day of July, 1983 next, and the Twenty-Fifth day of July, A.D. 1983 next, and all taxes remaining unpaid on said last named day shall carry until collected, a penalty at the rate of twelve percentum per annum upon such unpaid real estate and personal estate taxes, except that a penalty at the rate of twelve percentum per annum upon such unpaid excise taxes shall be levied.

Provided, however said taxes may be paid in four installments, the first installment of Twenty-Five percentum on or before the Twenty-Fifth day of July A.D. 1983 next, and the remaining installments as follows: Twenty-Five percentum on the Twenty-Fourth day of October A.D. 1983, Twenty-Five percentum on the Twenty-Fourth day of January A.D. 1984; and Twenty-Five percentum on the Twenty-Fourth day of April A.D. 1984. Each installment of taxes, if paid on or before the last day of each installment period successively and in order shall be free from any charges for interest.

If the first installment, or any succeeding installment of taxes, is not paid by the last day of the respective installment period or periods as they occur, then the whole tax or remaining

unpaid balance of the tax, as the case may be, shall immediately become due and payable and shall carry, until collected, a penalty at the rate of twelve percentum per annum on said real estate and personal estate, and penalty at the rate of Twelve percentum per annum on said excise vehicle.

The City Collector, shall by advertisement in a public newspaper of the City, notify all persons assessed to pay their respective taxes at his office on and between the said 1st and Twenty-Fifth day of July A.D. 1983 both days inclusive; said Collector shall attend daily during said periods, Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays excepted, at his office from Eight-Thirty o'clock A.M. to Four o'clock P.M. to receive taxes.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

Read and Passed the Second Time, on motion of COUNCILMAN FARMER, seconded by COUNCILMAN STRAVATO by the following Roll Call Vote:

Ayes: Councilman Annaldo, Councilwoman Brassil, Councilman Cola, Councilwoman DiRuzzo, Councilmen Farmer, Griffin, Petrosinelli and Stravato—8.

Noes: Council President Paolino, Councilmen Dillon, Easton, Councilwoman Fargnoli, Councilmen Glavin, O'Connor and Pitts—7.

The motion for Passage the Second Time, is Sustained.

On motion of COUNCILMAN GLAVIN, seconded by COUNCILMAN DILLON, it is voted to suspend Rule 2 of the Rules of the City Council in order to allow the City Council to meet on a Day other than provided in said Rule 2.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, on motion of COUNCILMAN GLAVIN, seconded by COUNCILMAN DILLON, the City Council adjourns at 8:40 o'clock P.M. (E.D.T.) to meet again on THURSDAY, JULY 14, 1983 at 8:00 o'clock P.M. (E.D.T.).
