Cesar A. Teo was born in Guatemala in June of 1970. In 1989, Mr. Teo left Guatemala due to civil war and poverty. When he arrived to the United States that same year, he moved to the Valley St area and has lived in the City ever since.

Currently, Mr. Teo serves as a Constituent Representative in the Mayor's Center for City Services, which provides streamlined, responsive and customer service oriented experience for residents seeking assistance from the City. Prior to joining Mayor Elorza's administration, Mr. Teo managed and operated his own small business in the auto glass industry.

Since 2001, Mr. Teo has served as a community organizer for the Guatemalan and Latino community, particularly through civic engagement. Mr. Teo founded the Guatemalan Center of NE in 2001. He still serves on the board of the Guatemalan Center of New England. In 2007, he was a community organizer for Latinos con Sheldon. From 2009 to 2010, Mr. Teo worked on two gubernatorial campaigns, Patrick Lynch and Former Governor Lincoln Chaffee. Finally, Mr. Teo served as a lead organizer for Latinos con Jorge during Mayor Elorza's 2014 campaign.
