No. 481 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT BUDGET FOR YEAR 35 AND AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT TO SUBMIT THE REVISED CDBG, HOME, ADDI, ESG AND HOPWA BUDGET AND APPLICATION TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT.

Dear Councilwoman DiRuzzo:

As you know, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) recently issued revised allocations for Year 35 of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG).

This requires the City to submit a revised CDBG Year 35 budget to HUD. The chart below details the revised funding levels for the CDBG, HOME, Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG), Housing Opportunities for People with AIDS (HOPWA) and American Dream Down Payment Initiative (ADDI).

I am recommending the CDBG funds be allocated to the Neighborhood Investment Strategy. This would result in each of the fourteen eligible City Council Ward accounts receiving an additional \$8,591. HOME and ADDI funds are authorized by the City Council as a total sum, and the attached amendment incorporates the updated allocations. The minor reduction in ESG funding is realized by a modest adjustment in the amount for each of the eleven recipients. Given the great need, I recommend the additional funds for HOPWA be awarded to AIDS Care Ocean State. We will request revised budget from that organization reflecting a commensurate increase in service across all areas served by the organization. Included with this letter is a draft ordinance that will enact the budget changes noted above. Should you have any questions, please feel free to contact me or Thom Deller, Director of the Department of Planning and Development. As always, it is a pleasure working with you and your colleagues on the City Council as we seek to strengthen and improve this great city.
