AN ACT

IN AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 832 OF THE PUBLIC LAWS OF RHODE ISLAND, JANUARY SESSION, 1940, ENTITLED "AN ACT TO REVISE, CONSOLIDATE AND AMEND CHAPTER 598 OF THE PUBLIC LAWS OF 1866 ENTITLED 'AN ACT TO REVISE, CONSOLIDATE AND AMEND THE ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE", AND THE SEVERAL ACTS IN ADDITION THERETO AND IN AMENDMENT THEREOF", CREATING A FINANCE DEPARTMENT IN THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, AND IN AMENDMENT OF THE PUBLIC LAWS OF 1971, CHAPTER 77, SECTION 1.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 77, Section 1 of the Public Laws of 1971 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"All purchases made and contracts executed by the purchasing agent shall be pursuant to a written requisition from the head of the office, department or other agency whose appropriation is to be charged; and no purchase order shall be issued or contract executed, nor shall any other agreement purporting to obligate the city be entered into unless and until the controller certifies that there is to the credit of the department, board, commission, bureau or other city agency concerned therewith a sufficient appropriation balance in excess of all unpaid obligations, to defray the cost of such supplies, materials, equipment or contractual services; and unless and until the budget director certifies that the purchase is consistent with policies established in the budget.

"Competitive bids shall be obtained where practicable for all purchases and for all public improvements not made by city departments or agencies. Contracts shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder except in cases where it is clearly to the advantage of the city to award the contract to some other bidder. Sealed bids shall be required

in all transactions amounting to or in excess of Three
Thousand (\$3,000) Dollars.

"Such bids shall be secured through public advertisement, shall be submitted to the city clerk and shall be publicly opened by the purchasing agent."

SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage, and all Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
