In our study we have determined that we should place the booth and get the electricity necessary would be from the Alarm Building is located, adjacent. It would be necessary to clear ground from the building at base on which to fasten the booth. No charge for the service except for the electricity used, and it would be necessary for the City to keep the booth in a clean condition. The Telephone Company in return would pay the City a commission of 20% over and above 25 cents per days on all revenues received, except for taxes and telegrams. We would do all repair work necessary to keep the public telephone a real convenience to the public.

May we solicit your kind help in securing for us the necessary approvals of those officials responsible if they agree in order that we may proceed with this public convenience.


