RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the alienation of our youth has become of public concern, and

WHEREAS, many youths complain that they are not considered important, loved or cared for and are just numbers, and

WHEREAS, there is a breakdown in family life and neighborhood morale that is brought on by divorce and the high mobility of the population, and

WHEREAS, many people in the community often do not know their next door neighbor and people who live on their street, and

WHEREAS, this is affecting youth in their desire to be wanted, loved, appreciated, and in developing a sense of identity, and

WHEREAS, our youth spend approximately thirteen years of their life, attending kindergarten, and thereafter the twelve grades of the standard public schools,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Providence School Committee undertake a study to determine the feasibility of reverting to neighborhood schools which will teach the normal grades from one through twelve, that the community high schools serve as speciality schools for those students who wish to acquire vocational or special training, and that students be given the opportunity to develop better student-teacher relationship with principals, assistant principals, teachers and faculty to encourage their emotional stability and sense of identity.
