

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

WHEREAS, Sergeant Edmond F. Malloy, Jr. was born in Providence on December 30, 1967 and grew up in the Mount Pleasant neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, He graduated with the Class of 1986 from La Salle Academy; and

WHEREAS, He set out on a path to serve his country first and worked hard to become a United States Marine attaining the rank of sergeant; and

WHEREAS, In 1988 he was accepted into the 52nd Providence Police Training Academy where he excelled and graduated in the top tier of the class; and

WHEREAS, He continued to serve as a U.S. Marine Corps Reserve veteran; and

WHEREAS, He served on the Providence police force for 30 years; and

WHEREAS, He served with honor in many roles while a member of the Providence Police Department including Patrol, Special Investigations Unit, Community Policing, Academy Field Training Officer, the Motorcycle unit, longtime member of the SWAT Team and Sniper Team Leader with the final assignment to the FBI Joint Terrorism Task Force; and

WHEREAS, He received several accolades including Chief's Awards, Commissioner's Award, the Fraternal Order of Police Award, American Society of Industrial Security Lifetime Achievement Award and others for distinguished service, bravery and duty; and

WHEREAS, He held high and close to his heart his deployment to Ground Zero after 911; and

WHEREAS, He was diagnosed with liver cancer five years ago and given a prognosis of six months to live, persevered through harsh chemotherapy, radiation treatments and surgeries; and

WHEREAS, Over \$250,000 has been raised in Ed's name to help cancer patients; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Edmond F. Malloy, Jr., age 51, passed away Thursday, October 31, 2019 at Rhode Island Hospital surrounded by family members, friends and dozens of fellow officers; and

WHEREAS, He will be remembered by all as larger than life who lived by a strict code of duty and tempered with an uncommon civility; and

WHEREAS, He was the loving father to his son Ryan, who currently serves with the Providence Police Department, daughter Meagan Malloy and husband to his wife Eloise. He also leaves behind his mother Maureen and his father Edmond Malloy, Sr., retired Lieutenant, Providence Police Department, as well as his sisters Karen L. Blair and Julie B. Malloy, his former wife and mother of his children, Diane Malloy and loyal, loving dog Maize.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Providence City Council does hereby thank Sergeant Edmond F. Malloy, Jr. for his selfless service to our City and does hereby recognize and remember his life and legacy.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Providence City Council extends its deepest condolences to the entire Malloy family and to his colleagues on the Providence Police Department.
