

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 595

Approved October 9, 1998

WHEREAS, During a visit to New York, Carole's son, Harold B. Pace, bought for his mother a book he thought she might find interesting on the Restoration and Preservation of Durham Cathedral and Durham Castle with all its buildings. The Castle is now Durham University, and

WHEREAS, Carole wrote to the Durham University Archivist with a few questions she thought relevant to Providence Preservation, and

WHEREAS, The Archivist and Carole B. Pace corresponded, comparing similar situations, our documents being from 1636 and theirs from 1066, or there about, and also about genealogical questions concerning the people who immigrated to her section of the world to his section of the world, and the economic conditions which led to the migrations, and

WHEREAS, The Durham Archivist was involved with the London School of Economics Summer Program of History and Architecture, and lectures on the subjects which Carole had written him. Carole shared with the Archivist the Genealogy he was interested in and Carole was able to explain the process used here to designate an historic property and mark it as an educational tool and the research involved in the process, and

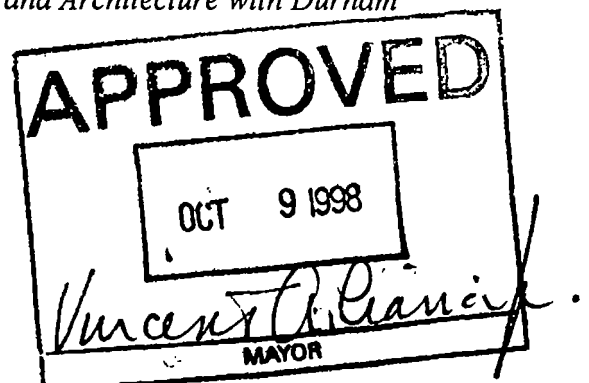

For three weeks, Carole stayed at a London School of Economics dorm called Rosebury Hall. Carole attended class at London School of Economics from 9:00 A.M. until 10:00 P.M. with architectural visits to the historic buildings she was studying. Carole visited churches designed by Christopher Wren, after which many of our churches are patterned. Carole also visited private homes, country estates and Municipal buildings, and

WHEREAS, The only thing missing from the course were the touristry excursions such as a visit to the Tower of London and changing of the guard at Buckingham Palace, but the course was packed with Historic and Architectural information.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Mayor and the Members of the City Council hereby congratulate City Archivist Carole B. Pace upon being invited to London, England to share our History and Architecture with Durham University.
