# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Approved February 13, 1969

RESOLVED, THAT His Honor the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to execute a deed of conveyance to Ernest DiGregorio of 11 Barry Court, North Providence, Rhode Island, for the parcel of land situated at the northeasterly corner of Langdon Street and Branch Avenue, shown as shaded area and designated by the letters A-B-C-D-E-F-G-H-A on the accompanying plan entitled, "Providence, R.I., P.W. Dept., Engineering Office-City Property Section, Plan No. 063252, Date January 28, 1969", having a total area of 10,339 square feet and is further identified as being Lot 63 on City Assessor's Plat 98. Said deed shall contain a twenty (20) foot easement for sewer purposes, and the restriction that no structure or improvement shall be erected thereon.

The above described parcel is subject to a twenty (20) foot perpetual right and easement designated by the letters J-K-L-M-N-J on the accompanying plan for the purpose of maintaining and operating a sewer in, across, through, and upon the above described premises, together with the right of the City of Providence, by its agents, servants, officers, and employees to enter said premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of repairing and operating a sewer with such tools and other equipment as may be necessary, and provided further that it is expressly understood and agreed by this grantee, his successors and assigns, that no structure shall be placed over or upon said easement nor shall the land over or upon said easement be used so as to endanger the sewer in any way.

Said deed of conveyance to Ernest DiGregorio is in consideration of the sum of TWELVE HUNDRED (\$1200) DOLLARS.

Dear Mr. Vespia:


In reply to your inquiry regarding sale of Lot 63 on Assessor's Plat 98, inspection and investigation revealed the following:

Lot 63 is vacant and unimproved. It is presently being used for parking.

This lot is a part of the land through which the Robin Brook sewer line runs. Consequently, any sale should be bound by an easement which will guarantee availability of the land for repair or service to the sewer line. Also, it should be legally stipulated that the owner may not construct buildings on, nor otherwise excavate the property.

Subject to the conditions stated above, and contingent upon concurrence by the Public Works Department, no objection is offered by this department to the sale of Lot 63.

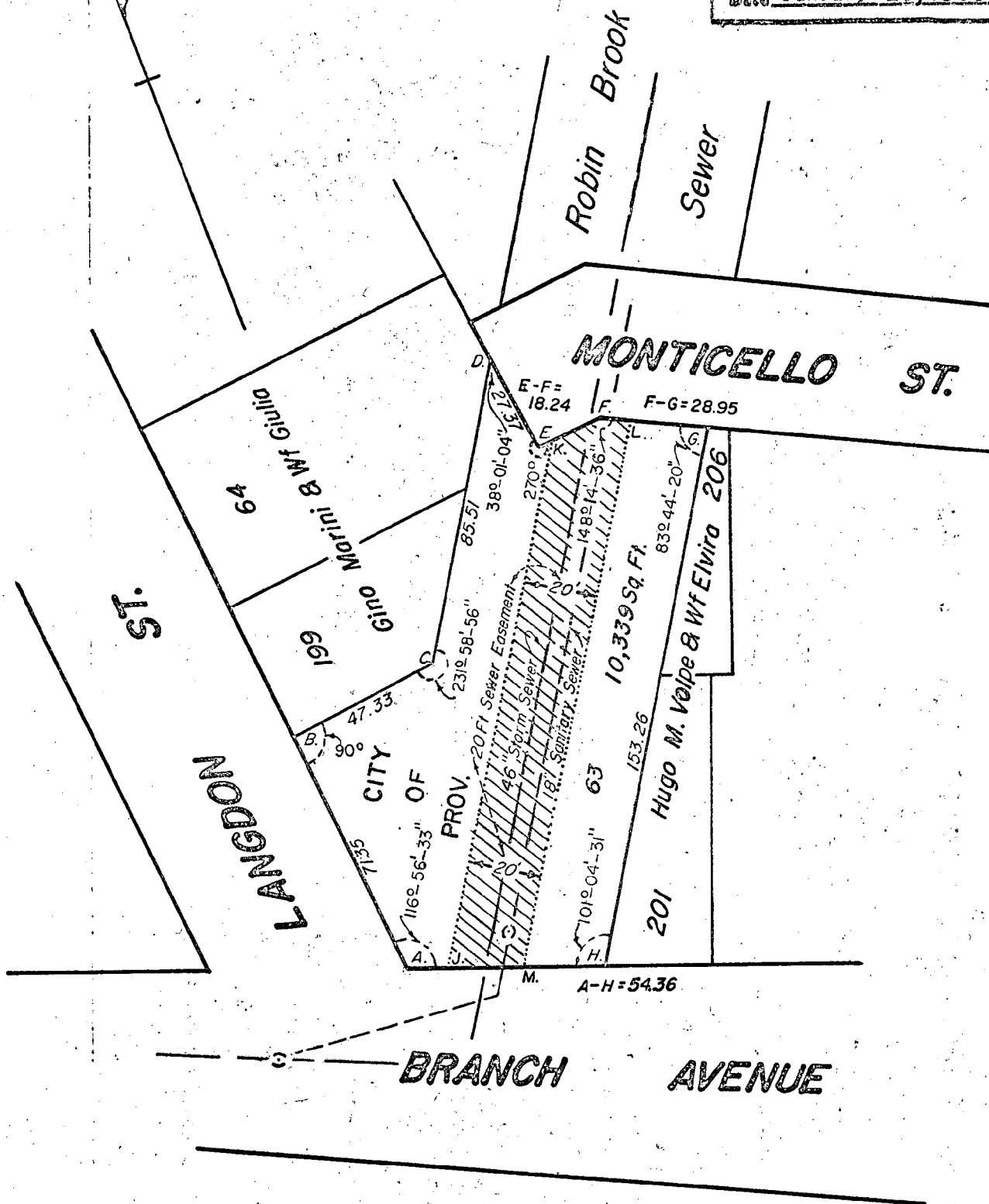
