Approved November 12, 1969





Honorable Sirs:

Your Clerk, under the provisions of Resolution of the City Council Number 50 approved January 21, 1969, investigated the possibility of compiling the Records of the Town Meetings of Providence from the year 1636 to 1832 to be published.

He conferred in the Department of City Clerk on October 21, 1969 with Professor Patrick T. Conley, Professor of History at Providence College, and Matthew J. Smith, Archivist and Instructor in History at Providence College on subject matter.

The conference revealed that the proposed publication should be a two-volume project, the cost estimated to be \$10,000.00. The return of the expenditure of that sum would be from the sale of such volumes at \$30.00 per copy. It was the sense of Messrs. Conley and Smith that these records should be published since it appears that the City of Providence is the last City of major importance that does not have its Colonial and Revolutionary periods published. The editorial work would be undertaken by Messrs. Conley and Smith and would require the employment of a clerk typist, who would become a member of the staff of the Department of City Clerk. Upon the completion of research and transposition in type, the engaging of a publishing house would be necessary.

Remuneration to Messrs. Conley and Smith for their editorial work would be a matter for subsequent consideration.
