PROVIDENCE — The funeral of Malik A. O'Connor, 17, of 218 Gallatin St., who died Sunday at Rhode Island Hospital after he and a friend were shot about 3:15 a.m. in a car parked on Croyland Road in South Providence, has been set for Saturday. He was a student of the Alternate Diploma Program in the Providence public schools.



Born in Providence, he was a son of Barry and Cleora (Francis) O'Connor of Providence. Malik was a former member of the South Providence

Boy's and Girls Club Basketball Teams.

Besides his parents, he leaves three brothers, Barry O'Connor Jr., Jamal O'Connor and Khari O'Connor, all of Providence; and paternal grandparents, Thomas and Virginia (Conceicao) O'Connor of Providence. He was the grandson of the late Richard and Cleora (Carter) Francis.

The funeral will be held Saturday at 9 a.m. from the Bell Funeral Home, 571 Broad St., with a Service of Christian Burial at 10 at St. Michael Church, Oxford Street. Burial will be in Gate of Heaven Cemetery, East Providence.

One victim, 18, dies after two are shot in parked car

PROVIDENCE — One Providence man has died and a second is in satisfactory condition after both were shot while they were in a parked vehicle early yesterday.

Malik O'Connor, 18, died yesterday at Rhode Island Hospital. Hospital officials would not release any additional information about him.

Herbert Brown, who police said is in his 20s, is in satisfactory condition at the hospital after the assault, which occurred about 3:15 a.m. yesterday, said Capt. John Ryan, spokesman for the Providence Police.

The two men were either parking their vehicle or had just parked in front of 24 Croyland Rd., when another vehicle pulled up to theirs. A suspect or suspects in the second car fired into the driver's side, Ryan said, striking O'Connor and Brown.

Ryan said police are investigating the shooting. He would not say whether they had any suspects.

"I will do something because it's my credibility," she said.

Nolan has drafted a prototype for a trust agreement that would require the city and the union to begin negotiating no later than Sept. 30 of this year.

According to the language in Nolan's draft, "the parties will use all good faith and their individual and collective best efforts" to reach a settlement no later than March 31, 1999.
