

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 223

Approved July 9, 2020

WHEREAS, In the past several weeks there has been a large public outcry for substantial reforms to how our country handles criminal justice; and

WHEREAS, Although much of the focus has currently been centered around policing, the significant amount of discretion prosecutors have in determining the outcome of criminal cases also plays a significant role in the current criminal justice system; and

WHEREAS, There are certain cases in which prosecutorial discretion grants a prosecutor the power to decide whether to save or destroy an individual's life, especially in cases in which a prosecutor may have the ability to charge a juvenile as an adult or require that a juvenile register as a sex offender; and

WHEREAS, Delinquency rates for juveniles increase significantly the moment they are charged with a crime and it can be difficult, if not impossible, for a juvenile to succeed in life if they are charged with a crime as an adult or forced to register as a sex offender; and

WHEREAS, Youth of color remain far more likely to be committed to a detention facility than white youth, with black youth being up to four times as likely to be committed; and

WHEREAS, It is imperative that proper protocols are in place to guide prosecutorial decision making in juvenile cases in order to avoid the risk of unjustly ruining a young person's life through aggressive prosecuting techniques.




BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That, upon passage, a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Attorney General for the State of Rhode Island.


