## CHAPTER 68-71

No. 490 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2, SECTION 199  
OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE  
(1946), AS AMENDED.

Approved November 25, 1968

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

SECTION 1. Section 199 of Chapter 2 of the revised ordinances of the City of Providence (1946), as amended is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 199. Same--Impounding Illegally Parked Vehicles.

Any police officer may remove and impound or cause to be removed or impounded any vehicle parked upon any street or highway, in such a violation of any parking regulation, other than overtime parking, as to constitute an obstruction to traffic. A charge of TEN (\$10) DOLLARS for towing, if such towing was performed during the hours of 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. or FIFTEEN (\$15) DOLLARS for towing, if such towing was performed during the hours of 6 p.m. to 8 a.m., plus a storage charge after the first four (4) hours of ONE (\$1) DOLLAR per day (24 hours), or for a fraction thereof for storage off the public highway, shall be paid to the Clerk of the Municipal Court or some official, person, firm or corporation designated by him before any such vehicle shall be released except for vehicles towed during periods when emergency regulations controlling parking and traffic movements during storm periods are in effect. The payment of such towing and storage charges shall not release the operator or owner of the vehicle from any penalty imposed for violation of a traffic regulation.

During periods when emergency regulations controlling parking and traffic movements during storm periods are in effect a towing charge not to exceed FIFTEEN (\$15) DOLLARS for passenger vehicles or small trucks with only four tires in contact with the ground or THIRTY (\$30) DOLLARS for trucks with six or more tires in contact

with the ground plus a storage charge after the first four (4) hours of ONE (\$1) DOLLAR per day (24 hours), or for a fraction thereof for storage off the public highway, shall be paid to the Clerk of the Municipal Court or some official, person, firm or corporation designated by him before any such vehicle shall be released. The payment of such towing and storage charges shall not release the operator or owner from any penalty imposed for violation of the emergency traffic regulations.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

That the following named person, firm or corporation is hereby granted permission to erect, alter or use a building or structure at the location named herein for the sale of petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil and their products, compounds and components as described and shown in and on the application therefor and accompanying plat, all on file in the Office of the Department of Building Inspection subject to the conditions that said person, firm or corporation shall not violate any of the laws of the State of Rhode Island or any of the Ordinances of the City of Providence relative to the erection, use or occupation of said structure and that said person, firm or corporation shall not allow petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil or their products, compounds or components, to be conveyed over or across any sidewalk by means of any pipe or hose, and upon such special conditions as are hereby enumerated and further provided that the Director of the Department of Building Inspection may authorize minor changes in the structural detail of plans on file, viz:

Nancy Gammino and Sibarco Stations, Inc. southeast corner of 664 Admiral Street and 767 River Avenue, Lots 50 and 52 on Plat 81; erect a new modern three (3) bay colonial type service station on both lots and install two (2) six thousand (6,000) gallon gasoline tanks, one (1) five hundred fifty gallon waste oil tank and one (1) five hundred fifty (550) gallon fuel oil tank, making a total storage capacity of 13,500 thirteen thousand five hundred gallons upon the premises.

The erection or location of any buildings or structures not shown on the original plat on file with the Director of Department of Building Inspection, or any change in the location of buildings or structures from that shown on said plat shall be deemed a violation of this permit.
