
Gentlemen:

In accordance with Council Resolution No. 608, Duke Street was authorized to be made one way from Smith Street to Orms Street.

During the installation of the signs designating this regulation, it became apparent that a serious problem of egress was created for the gasoline station located on the southwest corner of Smith and Duke Streets. This station has only one driveway on Smith, and relies on the Duke Street exit for the return movement of vehicles desiring to proceed along Smith Street. The problem is further complicated by the fact that narrowness of Duke Street makes it impossible for the large vehicles, such as tank trucks serving this station, to make the turn into Duke Street, if they were required to continue along this street in a one-way direction.

In order to eliminate this problem, and at the same time minimize the traffic interference on Smith Street caused by traffic using Duke Street, it is recommended that Duke Street remain a one-way street in a southerly direction, beginning at a point 85 feet south of Smith Street and continuing to Orms Street; and that the 85 feet portion of Duke Street between Smith and this point 85 feet south of Smith remain as a two-way street.
