

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Approved November 9, 1978

WHEREAS, The Christmas Shopping Season is imminent which will result in the influx of shoppers within the Downtown Shopping Area of Providence, and

WHEREAS, In the interest of public safety and security, it appears that additional security will be necessary in order to protect the interest of shoppers and merchants,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Commissioner of Public Safety is hereby requested to consider the feasibility of engaging additional assistance, in the form of Security Guards, preferably from the rank of Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA employees), so that the interest of the public and the merchants will be better served commencing the day following Thanksgiving, being November 24, 1978 to and including December 31, 1978.


