
WHEREAS, We support the theme of this Year's Rhode Island Earth Day Celebration, "Our Hope - A Clean and Green Rhode Island",

## FACT SHEET

### Earth Day - What it Means in Rhode Island

Since its start in 1970, Earth Day has served as a yearly catalyst for ongoing environmental education, action, and change. Activities surrounding Earth Day rekindle personal commitment and broaden the base of public involvement through active participation in a wide variety of events such as neighborhood cleanups, environmental lectures, classroom activities, educational exhibits, music and food.

Earth Day has been celebrated continuously in Rhode Island since its 20th anniversary in 1990. Every year, environmental organizations and agencies throughout the state cooperatively plan and carry out state-wide Earth Day celebrations. Tens of thousands of Rhode Islanders take part in the wide range of activities offered. Most programs are offered to the public free of charge. Not limited to a single day, the events occur through the year, climaxing on a weekend close to April 22, Earth Day. This year that weekend is April 26 and 27.

### Earth Day '97 - What's Happening in Rhode Island?

Earth Day '97 marks the 27th anniversary of Earth Day, and our theme for this year's celebration is *Our Hope - A Clean and Green RI!* Our theme of hope - Rhode Island's state motto - signifies our hope for continued environmental progress. We must work together to maintain the gains we have achieved and continue our efforts into the future, so we can preserve and protect our environment for ourselves and our children. Achieving this will improve not only our quality of life but our business climate as well, for businesses will flourish if Rhode Island is clean and green.

Our main goal for 1997 is to spread the message of increased awareness of environmental issues with a focus on litter prevention through the following activities: **EarthFest** - an environmental fair with vendor displays; **Concert Earth** - entertainment for the whole family; **community cleanups**; **local events** at colleges and in communities; and **Earth Day outreach** - local businesses promoting environmental awareness through the school poster/calendar contest, teacher workshops, displays at public events, and employee education.

### Earth Day '97 - Who's Making It Happen?

Responsibility for planning and promoting Earth Day '97 falls under the auspices of two of Rhode Island's main environmental agencies: The Environment Council of Rhode Island Education Fund and the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management OSCAR program. The Earth Day Committee, a group of dedicated volunteers, is working with the two agencies to plan the celebration.

Volunteers are needed to help set up and run EarthFest and Concert Earth and to clean up afterwards, to plan and organize neighborhood cleanups and other local events, and to approach local businesses to ask them to participate in Earth Day outreach. This can be the biggest Earth Day ever, but it won't happen without you!
