CHAPTER 1743

No. 1 **AN ORDINANCE** AMENDING SECTION 67 of CHAPTER 1715, "ESTABLISHING THE CLASSES OF POSITIONS, THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES and the NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES in CERTAIN CLASSES in the CITY DEPARTMENTS", AS APPROVED SEPTEMBER 17, 1965, RELATIVE TO THE CITY PLAN COMMISSION.

Approved January 10, 1966

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Chapter 1715 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 67: CITY PLAN COMMISSION

That part which has heretofore read: "The Number of Employees in the City Plan Commission shall not exceed twenty-two (22); shall hereafter read: "The Number of Employees in the City Plan Commission shall not exceed twenty-three (23)".

Add: One (1) Clerk Stenographer III

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.




Approved January 10, 1966

Resolved,





RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 6

Approved January 10, 1966

RESOLVED, That the sum of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000) Dollars is hereby ordered transferred by the Board of Commissioners of Sinking Funds from the "Fire Insurance Fund" established by Section 38 of Chapter 2 of the Revised Ordinances of 1946, entitled, "Fire Insurance Fund" to a separate account in the Capital Fund to be known as, "REPAIRS to ANIMAL BARN in ROGER WILLIAMS PARK".

Said sum or so much thereof as may be necessary shall be expended in repairing the fire damage at the Animal Barn in Roger Williams Park, said building having been damaged by fire.

Any balance remaining in said fund at the completion of the work shall revert to the "Fire Insurance Fund".
