WHEREAS, the replacement cost of broken windows in public buildings and more particularly public schools in the City of Providence last year approximated fifty-thousand dollars, according to the Superintendent of Public Buildings, and

WHEREAS, several leaders in the field of plastics have marketed sheets for glazing designed to withstand many times more impact than common glass, and which from reports may be a remedy against acts of vandalism which are annually costing the taxpayers of the City of Providence thousands of dollars.

Now Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the Director of Department of Building Inspection is hereby requested to investigate this area of glass substitute and to report back to the City Council as to the feasibility of such usage and his recommendation.

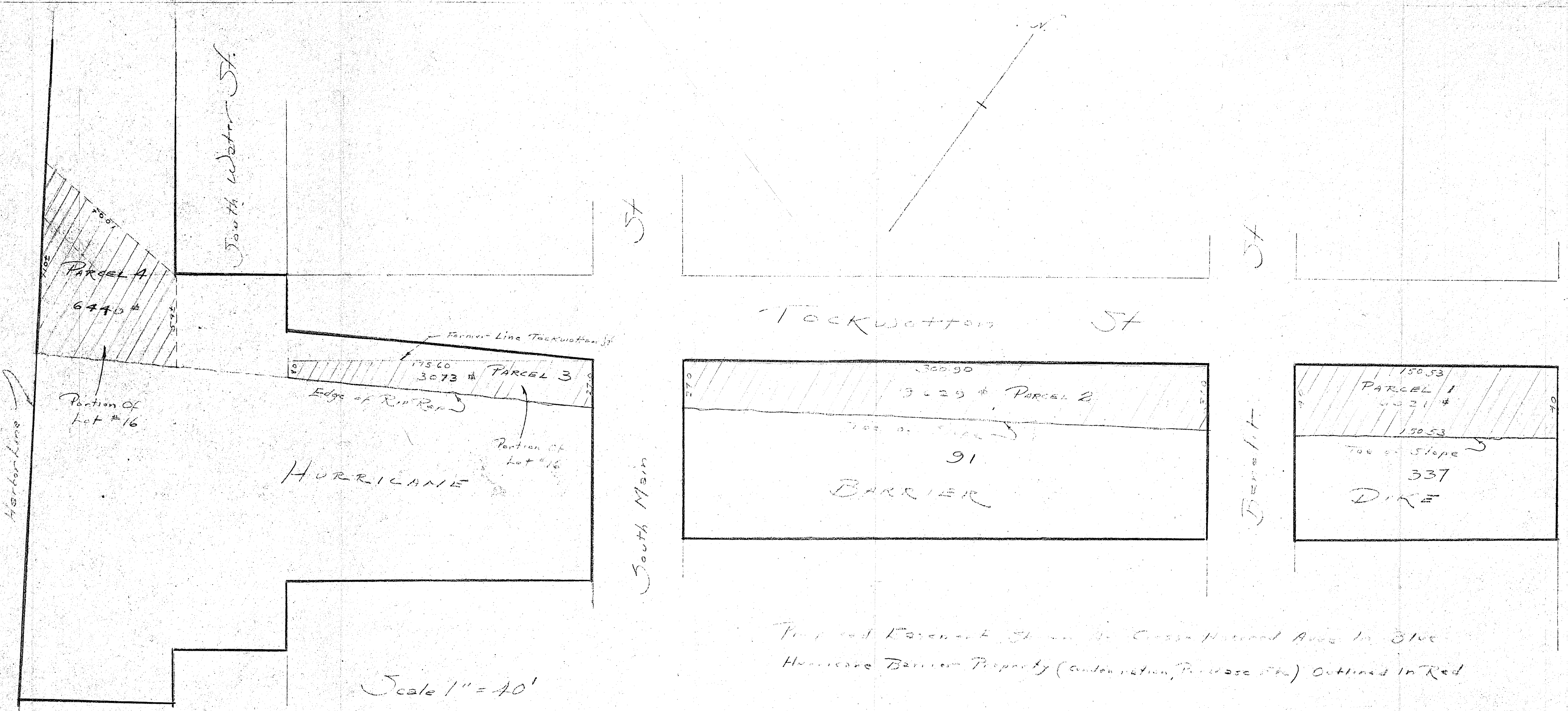
