# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

EFFECTIVE February 12, 2018

RESOLVED, That the City Council of the City of Providence does hereby respectfully request that the Director of the Department of Public Works develop and submit to the City Council a traffic calming plan for Mount Pleasant Avenue, from Beaufort Avenue to Smith Street, and the surrounding area, specifically addressing issues related to the installation and funding of traffic calming infrastructure, high traffic intersections, cut-through streets, and pedestrian crosswalks.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That said traffic calming plan shall reflect the recommendations of the State Department of Transportation's and the City Traffic Engineer's studies of the area, as well as input received from the abutting schools and residents at multiple community meetings.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That, within thirty (30) days, the aforementioned traffic calming plan shall be submitted to the City Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That, upon passage, copies of this resolution shall be sent to the Director of Public Works and the Traffic Engineer.

The following memo is a response to resolution 3 to be heard at the 1/17/18 Public Works Committee Meeting

1. Resolution Requesting the Director of the Department of Public Works develop a Traffic Calming Plan for Mt. Pleasant Ave.

**Response:** A conceptual safety improvement plan has been developed for Mt. Pleasant Ave. (Smith St. to Beaufort St.) as presented in the Road Safety Audit report for Mt. Pleasant Ave. The Rhode Island Department of Transportation has allocated funds for final design and construction of these improvements. We are awaiting a funding agreement from RIDOT to begin final design of the improvements. There is an ongoing traffic calming study for the Cathedral Avenue area. Currently a speed camera is located on Mt. Pleasant Ave. just north of the high school. The speed camera is expected to act as a deterrent to speeding on Mt. Pleasant Ave.
