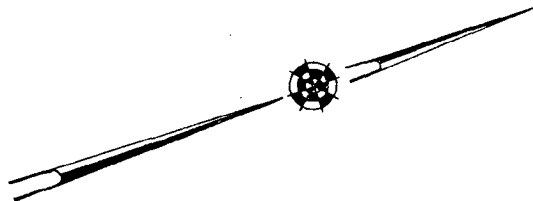

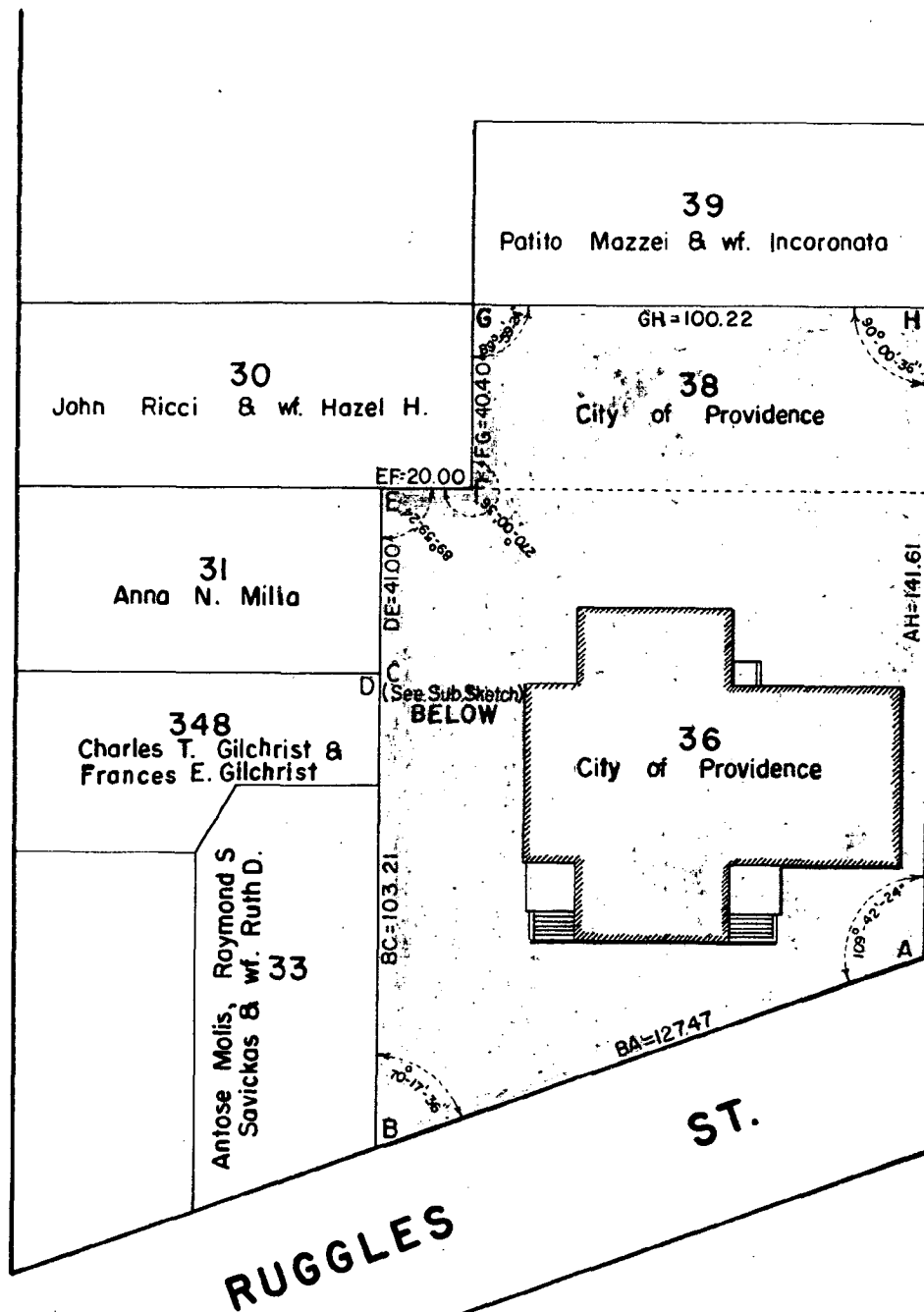

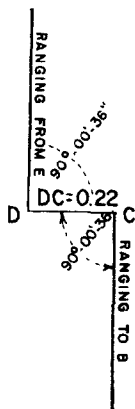

That the following minute on the life and character of the late John J. McGann, who departed this life on September 26, 1962, be and the same is hereby adopted, ordered inscribed on the records of this City Council and a copy thereof transmitted to the family of the deceased:

## M I N U T E

JOHN J. MCGANN, son of the late Michael J. and Mary E. (Brady) McGann, was a native of this city. His birth date was June 23, 1897.

Prior to World War I, in which he served as a member of the Army Air Force, he had been educated at Immaculate Conception School and English High School and had become a master craftsman in the jewelry trade. For many years he operated his own business - the Mac-Hul Manufacturing Co. - manufacturing religious articles. Early in life he became interested in governmental affairs and was successively a member of the 12th Ward Democratic Committee, Ward Chairman and then Councilman, serving from January 2, 1945 until January 3, 1949. The post war period saw numerous changes in our governmental structure providing new and expanded public services to which he gave steadfast support.

His simplicity, humility, integrity and generosity merited the high esteem in which he was held in the business, fraternal, political and religious life of this community.

His Honor, Mayor Walter H. Reynolds, and the members of this city council deplore the loss of such a devoted and civic-minded gentleman and extend sincere sympathy to his bereaved family.
