
Dear Vincent:



Dear Dennis:

Relative to your letter of November 28 enclosing copy of resolution of the Providence City Council regarding operations in the Silver Spring Yards. The Operating people advise that these yards are operated on a 24 hour basis in order to meet our freight and passenger service requirements. Diesel storage and fueling facilities are located in this immediate area, and during cold weather, it is necessary to keep diesel engines idling continuously even when not operating.

Unfortunately, the noise cannot practically be eliminated, but local forces are being cautioned to make every effort to minimize the noise level.
