

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Approved May 21, 1990

WHEREAS, The Providence Preservation Society will be holding its annual Festival of Historic Houses on the weekend of June 1, 2, and 3, 1990 and requires certain streets to be closed during certain hours.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Traffic Engineer and other appropriate departments of the City are requested to take appropriate action to close the below listed streets on the dates and during the times indicated below:

Friday, June 1 and Saturday, June 2 from 5:30 o'clock P.M. to 10:30 o'clock P.M.

Benefit Street, from the south side of College Street to the south side of Power Street.

George Street, between Benefit and Brown Streets.

Benevolent Street, between Benefit and Brown Streets.

Charlesfield Street, between Benefit and Brown Streets.

Power Street, between Benefit and Brown Streets.

Brown Street, between Power and George Streets.

Saturday, June 2 from 9:30 o'clock A.M. to 4:30 o'clock P.M.

Olney Street, between Hope Street and Arlington Avenue.

Alumni Avenue, between Hope Street and Morris Avenue.

Arlington Avenue, between Laurel Avenue and Barberry Hill.

Sunday, June 3 from 11:30 o'clock A.M. to 4:30 o'clock P.M.

Congress Avenue, between Elmwood Avenue and Melrose Street.

Ontario Street, between Elmwood Avenue and Melrose Street.

Lexington Avenue, between Elmwood Avenue and Melrose Street.



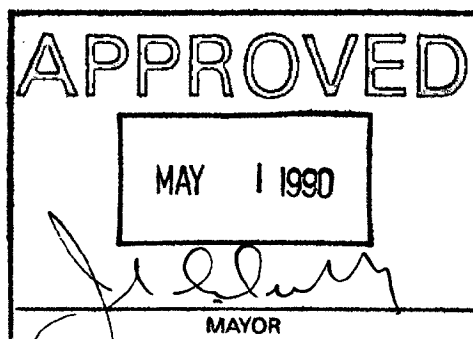

Preservation Society Festival of Historic Houses

Dear Mr. Farmer:

As we discussed yesterday on the phone, the 1990 Festival of Historic Houses, which is presented by the Providence Preservation Society and sponsored by Fleet National Bank and the Providence Journal Company, is to be held on June 1, 2, and 3. We appreciate your willingness to sponsor a resolution prohibiting vehicular traffic along certain streets in order to accommodate the Festival. As you suggested, I am also trying to reach Nicholas Easton and Robert Clarkin and will ask them to contact you.

Based on a review of our tour routes with the Providence Police Department, I respectfully request that your resolution provide that the following streets be closed to vehicular traffic (other than local traffic and the busses provided by the Society) on the dates and times indicated:

Friday, June 1 and Saturday, June 2 from 5:30 to 10:30 PM

- Benefit Street from the south side of College Street to the south side of Power Street
- George Street between Benefit and Brown Streets
- Benevolent Street between Benefit and Brown Streets
- Charles Field Street between Benefit and Brown Streets
- Power Street between Benefit and Brown Streets
- Brown Street between Power and George Streets

Saturday, June 2 from 9:30 AM to 4:30 PM

- Olney Street between Hope and Arlington
- Alumni Avenue between Hope and Morris
- Arlington Avenue between Laurel and Barberry Hill

Sunday, June 3 from 11:30 AM to 4:30 PM

- Congress Avenue between Elmwood and Melrose
- Ontario Street between Elmwood and Melrose
- Lexington Avenue between Elmwood and Melrose
- Atlantic Avenue between Elmwood and Melrose
- Adelaide Avenue between Elmwood and Melrose

In addition, I have discussed with the Providence Police Department prohibiting parking on certain streets along the routes to be used by the busses for the Festival. In case you need such information for your resolution, parking is to be prohibited at the following locations on the dates and times indicated:

June 1 and 2 from 5:30 PM to 10:30 PM

- George Street between Benefit and Brown Streets
- Brown Street between George and Power Streets
- Power Street between Brown and Benefit Streets

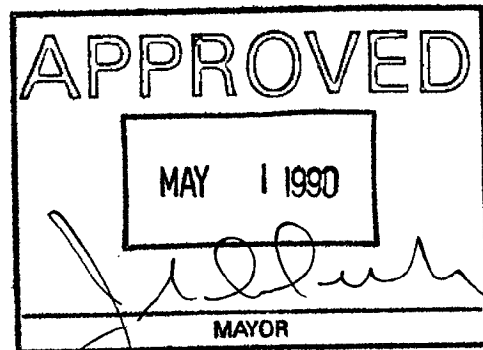
