AN ACT

TO AMENDMENT OF PARAGRAPH 2 OF SECTION 1 OF CHAPTER 1229 OF THE PUBLIC LAWS OF 1904, ENTITLED "AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE TO MAKE BUILDING REGULATIONS AND PROVIDE FOR THEIR ADMINISTRATION", AS AMENDED BY CHAPTER 123 OF THE PUBLIC LAWS OF 1904.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1: Paragraph 2 of Section 1 of Chapter 1229 of the Public Laws of 1904, entitled "An Act Authorizing the City of Providence to Make Building Regulations and Provide for Their Administration", as amended by Chapter 123 of the Public Laws of 1904, is hereby further amended in its entirety to read as follows:

"Section 1.1 ccc

" 2. To regulate the erection of buildings, to provide for the removal of any buildings which are deemed to be unsafe by reason of inadequate maintenance, dilapidation, obsolescence or abandonment, to authorize the removal of said unsafe buildings, to make said buildings safe by necessary repairs, or to remove said unsafe building; to authorize a lien upon said premises for any costs incurred by the City of Providence in making safe or removing such unsafe structures; to authorize such lien to be recorded in the office of the Recorder of Deeds in the same manner as the recording of his personal notices; and to authorize the foreclosure of said lien in the same manner provided by law for the enforcement of a common law lien on personal property."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

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AN ACT

IN AMENDMENT OF AND IN ADDITION TO CHAPTER 489 OF THE PUBLIC LAWS, 1923, ENTITLED "AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE RETIREMENT OF EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE" AS AMENDED.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 489 of the Public Laws of 1923, as amended, is hereby amended by adding a new section 20 to read as follows:

"Sec. 20. Anything to the contrary in this chapter notwithstanding, the following provisions shall apply with respect to any member who was an employee of the City by reason of his employment at the Charles V. Chapin Hospital or in the City Health Department and who on or after October 1, 1965 and prior to his attainment of age 60 becomes a member of the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island

(1) Membership of such a member shall cease as of the date he ceases to be an employee of the City or becomes an employee of the School Department thereof and he shall have no rights under the System except as hereinafter provided in this section 20.

(2) All funds held in the Employees' Retirement System of the City of Providence on account of such a member which are attributable to his own contributions shall be transferred to the proper fund in the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island and such transfer shall be a complete discharge of all liability of this System with respect thereto; provided, however, that any excess of the amount of such funds over the amount certified by the Retirement Board of the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island be equal to the contribution credits which he would then have had under such System if the entire period of service credited to him under this System had been rendered as an employee of the State of Rhode Island, shall be paid to him in a single lump sum prior to the first day of January, 1967.

(3) In addition, there shall be transferred an amount which, when taken with the funds transferred in accordance with subdivision (2) above, shall be equal to the amount certified by the Retirement Board of the Employees' Retirement System of the

State of Rhode Island as being required to provide service credit in such System for all purposes thereof for all service rendered the City of Providence; provided, however, that if the funds held hereunder on account of such members which are not attributable to their own contributions are not sufficient to provide such amount, the City of Providence shall contribute to the State System the deficit.

(4) Upon payment of the amounts herein provided, the employee shall be credited under the State System with all service and benefits that he would have had thereunder if all his City employment had been as an employee of the State."

Section 2. This Act shall take effect immediately, and all acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.






Shaded Areas A·B·C·D·A
