**April Chase-Lubitz**

Before leaving the workforce to raise her children, April Chase-Lubitz spent over fifteen years in healthcare administration, marketing and development, and strategic planning. She served as Vice President of Marketing and Planning for Sargent Rehabilitation Center, Director of Marketing and Development for Bradley Hospital, and Director of Blue Cross Blue Shield Rhode Island's health and wellness program. In addition she served as a consultant to Checkerboard Ltd, a family-owned personal stationery company, to market and develop business partnerships for its online store.

Prior to relocating to Rhode Island in 1987, Ms. Chase-Lubitz was the Program Development Coordinator for Tennessee's original Area Health Education Center based at Meharry Medical School. The federally funded AHEC program provided desperately needed medical services to rural Tennesseans through a systematic rotation of medical students to those areas. She served as the Executive Director of that program's first rural-based center.

Over the past ten years Ms. Chase-Lubitz has been involved in various volunteer organizations. She became actively involved with Festival Ballet Providence as both a hands-on volunteer and Trustee. In September of 2010 April stepped in on a full-time basis to assist the Artistic Director in managing the ballet's operations. Ms. Chase-Lubitz also served as Trustee and Board Chair for Fellowship Health Resources, Vice President of the Rocky Hill School Parent Organization, and Education Committee member for Trinity Repertory Theater.
