AN ORDINANCE IN AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 27 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES ENTITLED: "THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE ZONING ORDINANCE, APPROVED JUNE 27, 1994, AS AMENDED

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

ARTICLE X. DEFINITIONS

The following Section is hereby amended by adding the following:

Sec. 1000. Terms defined.

1000.157. *Neighborhood Restaurant / Spa* is a lunch room, luncheonette, restaurant, cafeteria, spa, or other place for the service or sale of food or drinks for on-premises consumption with a seating capacity of no more than 20 (twenty) patrons at a counter and/or at tables, and whose principal business is the sale of foods, frozen desserts or beverages to the customer in a ready-to consume state and whose design or principal method of operation is such that customers may be served their foods, frozen desserts or beverages by a restaurant employee at the same table or counter at which said items are consumed. Such establishments may also sell foods, frozen desserts or beverages that are usually served in edible containers, or paper, plastic or other disposable containers, for carry out or delivery purposes, provided that neither food nor drink is served to, or consumed by, persons while seated in motor vehicles.

**Re: CPC Referral 3301: Proposed Ordinance to Change Zoning Ordinance Text for
Neighborhood Restaurant/Spa Definition**

Dear Councilman Solomon:

At a regular meeting of the City Plan Commission (CPC) on February 26, 2008, and pursuant to Section 1100 of the City of Providence Zoning Ordinance Chapter 1994-24, No. 365, as amended, the Commission reviewed a proposal to amend Use Code 56 to include neighborhood restaurants or "spas." The Commission voted unanimously as described below to make certain findings of fact and to advise the City Council to adopt the change as presented, with one condition.

Findings of Fact

Article XI of the Zoning Ordinance requires that in order for the CPC to make a positive recommendation on amendments to the Ordinance, it must demonstrate consistency with the Comprehensive Plan and with the purposes of zoning as listed in Section 100 of the Ordinance.

This proposal is consistent with the comprehensive plan and zoning ordinance in that it consistently implements state law and protects public health, safety and welfare.

Recommendation

The Commission voted to advise the City Council to adopt the change as presented, with the provision that the Planning Department work with Councilman Aponte on using a different word than "spa" for this definition.
