ORDINANCE SECOND READING

The following Ordinance was in City Council
December 18, 1975, Read and Passed the First
Time and is Returned for Passage the Second
Time:

An Ordinance in Amendment of and in Addition to Chapter 1272 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence Entitled, "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting the Official Redevelopment Plan for the Lippit Hill Project, No. R. I. R-3."

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

1. That Chapter 1272 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, entitled "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting the Official Redevelopment Plan for the Lippit Hill Project No. R. I. R-3," which was duly approved on the 5th day of June, 1959, as heretofore amended, be and is hereby further amended as follows:

Delete paragraph in Section H1(j) PERMITTED SIGNS for Site D only and insert the following instead:

Site D: Exterior signs on this site shall be limited to wall sign and parapet sign; provided that one sign mounted on a free standing tower or pylon may be permitted for this site as well as necessary directional signs. Wall sign and parapet sign shall be the belt type attached to and parallel with the building wall or parapet, and shall have a maximum height of four feet and shall not extend above the roof line or parapet. Wall sign and parapet sign shall have a maximum area of three square feet for each running foot of the face of the building on which sign is displayed. A maximum projection shall be 12 inches from the face of the building wall for wall sign, 12 inches from the face of the parapet for parapet sign except French roof type parapet sign. Maximum projection for French roof type parapet sign shall be 24 inches from the parapet to the bottom of the sign, 48 inches from the

parapet to the top of the sign. Direction signs shall have a maximum area of three square feet. No sign shall be flashing or animated. All signs shall be limited to the single identification of the building use or occupant. All proposed signs based on the above controls, the placement or replacement of any sign during the duration of the Plan must be approved by the Redevelopment Agency. The Agency in its sole and absolute discretion shall have the final right of approval.

2. That said Chapter 1272 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence as adopted and as heretofore amended, be and the same is hereby ratified and affirmed in all other respects.

3. That this Ordinance shall take effect on its passage and shall be filed with the City Clerk who is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy thereof to the Providence Redevelopment Agency.
