SECTION 1. Chapter 27 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence, Entitled: "The City of Providence Zoning Ordinance," Approved November 24, 2014, As Amended, is hereby further amended to Change Certain Text in Section 1907(E)(2)(e) as follows:

Emergency Demolition - Should the Director of the Department of Inspections and Standards determine that a structure is unsafe or hazardous and an imminent hazard to public safety for a reason such as being in danger of imminent collapse from damage caused by human action or an act of God, a committee consisting of the Director of the Department of Inspections and Standards, Fire Marshal, Planning Director, a structural engineer to be hired under City auspices, and the Chair of the Downtown Design Review Committee, or their designees, shall convene immediately and evaluate whether the structure should be demolished. The committee shall evaluate all pertinent information, including, but not limited to, the structural condition of the structure, the historic value of the structure, and the danger to the public. The Director may order partial or full demolition based on the consensus of the committee. If the Director of the Department of Inspections and Standards, in consultation with on-site life safety officials, determines that the structure is in danger of imminent collapse or is an immediate danger to

WHEREAS, As leaders in conservation and animal care, Roger Williams Park Zoo provides engaging experiences that empower guests to learn and join in conserving wildlife and wild places; and

WHEREAS, The Zoo is the most visited single attraction in Rhode Island, with a record 835,000 visitors last year; and

WHEREAS, The Roger Williams Park Zoo was the first zoo in New England to earn accreditation from the Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA); and

WHEREAS, The Zoo's educational programs directly touch more than 138,000 learners of all ages each year; and

WHEREAS, The Zoo's national and international conservation efforts have been recognized with more than 20 awards from AZA and the US Fish and Wildlife Service over the past 2 decades; and

WHEREAS, The zoo has played a key role in educating guests from New England and beyond about the importance of wildlife and wild places while providing the community with a safe, accessible, and fun place to enjoy time together.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Providence City Council hereby celebrates the 150th year anniversary of Roger Williams Zoo.

Resolution Recognizing and Supporting the Roger Williams Zoo and the Association of Zoos and Aquariums in their efforts to preserve the endangered red wolves as well as other endangered species in the United States.

WHEREAS, The Roger Williams Zoo recently became home to a new red wolf pup which is significant as red wolves are an endangered species; and

WHEREAS, According to the Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA) red wolves are critically endangered with less than 30 left in the wild, while roughly 250 remain in the AZA American Red Wolf SSP (Species Survival Plan) breeding program; and

WHEREAS, The American red wolf was one of the first species protected under the Endangered Species Preservation Act as well as one of the first species added to the list of endangered species after the passing of the Endangered Species Act; and

WHEREAS, Conservation efforts have long been underway to protect the American red wolf from extinction. Red wolf reintroduction programs intended to promote breeding in the wild and species survival in addition to genetic health have led to an increase in the population of wild red wolves; and

WHEREAS, As of today, the red wolf conservation program is helping to protect red wolves and increase populations, but further conservation efforts are needed to ensure species survival; and

WHEREAS, The Providence City Council received a moving letter from the Roger Williams Zoo Conservation Heroes Zoo Camp highlighting the importance of continuing the preservation efforts for the American red wolf population, a full copy of the letter is attached as Exhibit A.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Providence City Council recognizes and supports the Roger Williams Zoo and the Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA) in their efforts to preserve the endangered red wolves as well as other endangered species in the United States.

BE IT URTHER RESOLVED, That the Providence City Council recognizes and extends its deepest gratitude to the Zoo Camp for their tireless work and advocacy towards raising awareness of the vital role of the red wolves in the ecosystem.
