RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE TO PREPARE AND SUBMIT APPLICATIONS UNDER TITLE I OF THE LOCAL PUBLIC WORKS CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT AND INVESTMENT ACT OF 1976

WHEREAS, Title I of the Local Public Works Capital Development and Investment Act of 1976 (Public Law 94-369) authorizes the Secretary of Commerce to make 100 per cent Federal grants to cities for construction, renovation, repair, or other improvements of local public works projects and for the completion of plans, specifications, and estimates for local public works projects where either architectural design or preliminary engineering or related planning has already been undertaken, and

WHEREAS, the City of Providence deems it necessary and in the public interest (1) to undertake specific projects within the definition of local public works projects and (2) to provide for additional architectural and engineering work or related planning to permit construction of local public works project, and

WHEREAS, the City of Providence, in order to obtain such grants must assure and certify that it shall comply with all the regulations, policies, guidelines and requirements for the acceptance and use of Federal funds and gives assurance and certifies it will comply with the assurances contained in Part VI of the Local Public Works Capital Development and Investment Program application.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Providence as follows:

1. It is hereby found necessary and in the public interest for the City of Providence to make applications to the Secretary

Dear Mr. Vespia:

The attached Resolution is being forwarded for transmittal to City Council in order that the City may apply for Federal grants under the Title I of Public Works Employment Act of 1976. The application itself requires the Mayor's signature as the authorized representative of the City.

The grants under this new Act are of four types:

1. Direct 100 percent grants for local public works projects
2. Supplemental grants to provide the entire local share of other federally funded public work projects
3. Supplemental grants to provide the state or local share (but not both) of projects funded under state or local laws
4. Direct grants to supplement local funds for a local public works project.

As can be seen from the above, passage of the attached Resolution does not commit the local government to any expenditure of its own resources other than that which may have already been budgeted or committed to a specific project prior to application under the Public Works Employment Act of 1976.

The timing of these applications is crucial to our success in qualifying for these new funds. Expeditious approval of this Resolution will enhance our ability to make early applications for these funds.
