The undersigned respectfully petition your honorable body

For that, and whereas, in September of 1958, the Probate Court of the City of Providence transferred from Registry Account No. 53865 the funds of a missing legatee, Catherine E. O'Brien, to the office of the City Treasurer.


That on the 19th day of February, 1958, your petitioner, Elizabeth O'Brien Duquette, the only living heir at law of said Catherine E. O'Brien, prayed the Probate Court of the City of Providence to appoint an administrator for the estate of said Catherine, who had been missing and unheard from for a period of over 40 years. After hearing in the Probate Court, the petition was denied.

Upon a claim of appeal to the Superior Court for the County of Providence, and after a hearing on the merits before Mr. Justice Perkins on the 12th day of January, 1959, the decision of the Probate Court was reversed, and a decree was entered appointing Elizabeth Duquette as Administratrix of the estate of Catherine E. O'Brien, a certified copy of the said decree being herein appended for reference.

Subsequently, on the 9th day of March, your petitioner was duly qualified as Administratrix of the said estate by the Probate court.

Your petitioner further avers that the estate of Catherine E. O'Brien Consists entirely of the monies now in the possession of the office of the City Treasurer; and your petitioner requests and prays that this honorable body direct the city treasurer to return the said monies, amounting to \$3,181.61, to the Probate Court for distribution under Probate No, 59513.

This cause came to be heard before me on the 12th day of January, 1959, on the petitioner's appeal from a decree of the Probate Court of the City of Providence denying the petition of Elizabeth Duquette for the appointment of an administrator for the estate of her sister, Catherine E. O'Brien, and after hearing thereupon and in consideration thereof, the following findings of fact are made and established:

1. That Catherine E. O'Brien has been absent for over forty years without any word in regard to her despite efforts by the petitioner, her brother, and a detective agency to locate her.

2. That the unexplained absence of Catherine E. O'Brien for a period of more than seven years raises and indulges the presumption of the death of Catherine E. O'Brien.

3. That there has been no credible evidence presented which in any manner rebutted the presumption of the death of Catherine E. O'Brien.

4. That a certified copy of the transcript of the evidence taken at trial has been lodged with the City Registrar in the City of Providence in order that the facts from which death is presumed may there appear of record.

WHEREUPON, UPON CONSIDERATION OF THE FACTS FOUND
AND ESTABLISHED, IT IS

ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED

FIRST: The decree of the Probate Court of the City of

Providence denying the appointment of an administrator for the estate of Catherine E. O'Brien is hereby reversed.

SECOND: Elizabeth Duquette be and she is hereby appointed as administratrix of the estate of Catherine E. O'Brien with a corporate surety bond of \$4,000.00 to be furnished, and Francis J. McElhiney of Cranston be and he is hereby appointed appraiser of said estate.

THIRD: A certified copy of the within Decree is hereby ordered to be transmitted to the Probate Court of the City of Providence.





The undersigned respectfully petition your honorable body

to abandon as public highways portions of the following streets,
Viz:

Amy Street, from Butler Avenue, westerly to land of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad Company.

Preston Street, from Butler Avenue, westerly to land of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad Company.

Wayland Avenue, from a point 100 feet south of the south line of East George Street, southerly to land of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad Company.

This petition does not include a small portion of Amy Street, as shown on the original plat, south of Lot 200 on Assessors Plat 14 as in 1916 the Board of Tax Assessors, in an action in common practice at that time in affect, abandoned for tax purposes only portions of Amy Street, Preston Street and Wayland Avenue, thus adding a portion of Amy Street (some 50 x 20 foot area) to the area of Lot 200. This action by the Board of Tax Assessors has no legal bearing on the status of any of the streets involved. As the petitioner does not own Lot 200, this would mean that this portion of Amy Street would not be included in the proposed abandonment.

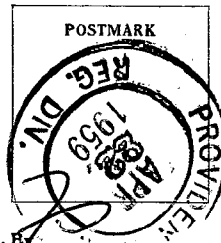

The sender is *not* required to pay a registration fee providing for full indemnity coverage (up to the limit of \$1,000). However, if the actual value of the matter mailed exceeds \$25, the sender must pay a fee of at least 55 cents. The 30-cent registration fee applies only to matter having no intrinsic value and does not provide for indemnification. Some matter having no intrinsic value, so far as the registry service is concerned, may involve considerable cost to duplicate if lost or destroyed. The sender is privileged to pay a higher than minimum registration fee for insurance against costs of duplication if desired.

Domestic registered mail is subject to surcharge when the declared value exceeds the maximum indemnity covered by the fee paid by \$1,000 or more. Claims must be filed within 1 year from date of mailing.

This referral is a request for the abandonment of portions of Amy and Preston Streets and Wayland Avenue to its southerly termination.


On the field trip it was found that the areas in question are unpaved, also vacant except for vegetation.

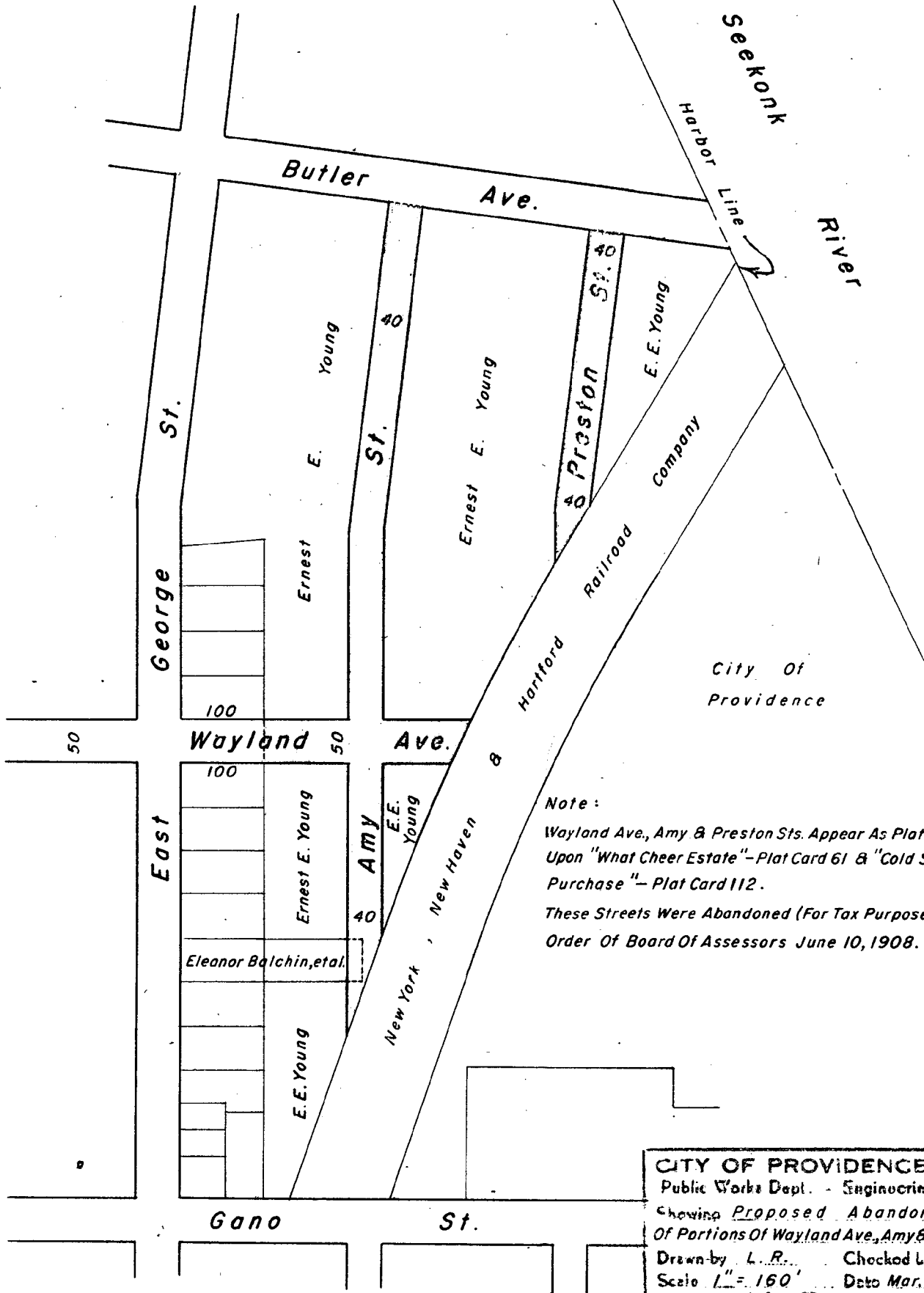
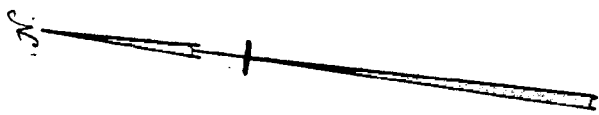
