RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 234

Approved March 9, 1979

WHEREAS, Rabbi Israel M. Goldman, noted founder of Temple Emanu-El has passed to his eternal repose in his seventy-fifth year, and

WHEREAS, A native of Warsaw, Poland, he has been a resident of Providence since 1925 and became instrumental in founding the Jewish congregation, and

WHEREAS, In devotion to his religion, he gave unstintingly of his talent and time in the organization of the Rhode Island Seminar on Human Relations and served as a member of numerous social action programs, and

WHEREAS, Having developed a national reputation as a Jewish religious leader, in 1946 he was elected President of the Rabbinical Assembly of America, and

WHEREAS, Upon moving to Baltimore, he continued his social work with pride and endeavor wherein his contributions to that community are well known for his service on behalf of inter-faith and inter-racial understanding, and

WHEREAS, The citizens in the communities in which he resided have gained a richer heritage due to his ecumenical contributions which will remain in their hearts and minds forever,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That in the loss of Rabbi Israel M. Goldman from this life, the Members of the City Council pause in their deliberations to offer their prayers for his eternal repose, and extend their heartfelt sympathy to his wife Mildred and to their family in the great loss they have sustained.
