REPORT TO THE CITY COUNCIL

Gentlemen:

The Providence Redevelopment Agency, in accordance with the provisions of Paragraph 11 of Chapter 1272 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved June 5, 1959, and Title 45, Chapter 32, Section 5 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, hereby reports concerning the proposed sale of real property within the Lippitt Hill Project No. R.I. R-3.

This Agency proposes to sell to the Olney Street Baptist Church, a non-profit corporation, organized and operating under the laws of the State of Rhode Island, a parcel of land situated on Olney Street and the present Camp Street. An agreement has been prepared wherein the Olney Street Baptist Church has agreed to accept a sum of money for the land and improvements formerly owned by it as the fair value thereof and to pay the fair re-use price for the land to be disposed pursuant to this report.

The agreement presently provides for the Olney Street Baptist Church to purchase 53,021 square feet of land at 20¢ per square foot for a total price of \$10,604.20.

In the event it is not possible to convey said site, the agreement provides for an alternate site on Olney Street of 52,908 square feet of land at 20¢ per square foot for a total price of \$10,581.60.

The Olney Street Baptist Church proposes to erect a new church on said site with ample off-street parking for the congregation. It will also be necessary for the proposed purchaser to submit plans and specifications prior to conveyance.




