The City Solicitor's Office which by charter is responsible for legal matters pertaining to the City should be authorized to contract for title work on tax reverted properties as opposed to the City Treasurer whose duties pertain to non-legal matters. Further, should the work performed under contract exceed limits as prescribed by the Providence City Charter then the Board of Contract and Supply shall be the contracting agency of the government.

Communication, dated November 27, 1981, Informing the Honorable City Council of His Disapproval and Veto of that Resolution Requesting the Bureau of Licenses to Continue the Current Moratorium on the Granting of Licenses for Mechanical Devices.

Dear Honorable Members:

I hereby disapprove and veto a resolution that would request the Bureau of Licenses to continue a moratorium on the granting of licenses for mechanical devices. With the role of the Bureau of Licenses clearly stated and prescribed by the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island and the Providence City Charter, any intrusion that would in any way hamper their decision or inhibit their actions seems to me to be unwarranted.

By virtue of Rhode Island General Laws §§ 5-2-10 and 5-2-14, Providence City Charter Section 5.35 et seq., and Chapter 14 of the Providence Code of Ordinances, the Bureau of Licenses has the exclusive authority to grant licenses to operate mechanical devices. Moreover, as the sole licensing authority in the City of Providence, the Bureau of Licenses is the only governmental body in the City that has the expertise that is necessary to make a determination as to whether or not there exists a need for a moratorium on the granting of such licenses.

Under Section 633 et seq., of the Providence

Code of Ordinances, the Director of Personnel is empowered with the supervision of all personnel in the City of Providence. Thus, the appointment of the Personnel Director as the person to enter into settlement agreements of any workmen's compensation claim is the only permissible one.

ORDINANCES SECOND READING

The following Ordinances were in City Council November 19, 1981 Read and Passed the First Time and Are Returned for Passage the Second Time:

An Ordinance Requiring that Fiscal Notes be Submitted to the City Council with All Resolutions and Ordinances.

It is the intention of the City Council and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence and the Sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.

Be It Ordained By The City Of Providence:

Section 1. Fiscal notes — When Required. All Ordinances and Resolutions having an effect on the revenues, expenditures or fiscal liability of the City, excepting the Ordinance adopting the proposed city budget for any city fiscal year, including the appropriation, classification and compensation ordinances and any amendments thereto, and other appropriation measures carrying specific dollar amounts, shall be accompanied by an explanatory statement or note which sets forth the estimated dollar effect thereof. Such statements or notes shall be known as "fiscal notes", and they shall be inserted at the end of each such ordinance or resolution prior to consideration.

Sec. 2. Content of fiscal notes. Fiscal notes shall wherever possible, cite effect in dollar amounts for the current fiscal year and estimates for the next two (2) succeeding fiscal years. No comment or opinion relative to the merits of the bill shall be included, excepting however, that technical or mechanical defects may be noted.

Sec. 3. Requests for fiscal notes. Fiscal notes shall be requested only by the Chairperson of the

City Council Finance Committee upon being notified by another committee chairperson, the sponsor of the Ordinance or Resolution, the Internal Auditor, or the Chairperson of the Providence Review Commission.

Sec. 4. Preparation of fiscal notes. Fiscal notes requests shall be made in such form and substance as may be required by the City Council Finance Committee Chairperson and shall be forwarded through the Internal Auditor to the Finance Director who shall determine the departments affected. The Finance Director shall then be responsible, in cooperation with such departments, for the preparation of the fiscal note.

Sec. 5. Return of fiscal notes. Fiscal notes shall be returned by the Finance Director to the Internal Auditor within five (5) working days from the date the request by the Chairperson was made. The Internal Auditor shall note his approval as to the accuracy and reliability of the dollar estimates or append his comments or exception thereon. The Internal Auditor, within three (3) working days, shall forward the fiscal note to the Chairperson of the City Council Finance Committee, the Chairperson of the Committee considering the Ordinance or Resolution, the sponsor of the Ordinance or Resolution, and the Chairperson of the Providence Review Commission or his designee.

Sec. 6. No Ordinance or Resolution requiring the fiscal note shall be acted upon by the full City Council unless a fiscal note is appended thereto or unless the Finance Committee shall have appended thereto a description of its efforts to

obtain such a fiscal note and/or the reasons for the absence thereof.

Sec. 7. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its Passage.

An Ordinance in Amendment of Section 6, Sub-Section 2 of the Appropriation Ordinance Chapter 1981-39, Effective July 20, 1981, Relative to Car Allowances.

Be It Ordained By The City Of Providence:

Section 1. Chapter 1981-39 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, effective July 20, 1981, entitled: "An Ordinance Making an Appropriation of One Hundred Forty-Nine Million, Eight Hundred Sixty-Two Thousand, One Hundred Twenty-Two Dollars and Nine Cents (\$149,862,122.09) as amended, is hereby further amended by adding the following:

"The Finance Director is hereby authorized to approve payment of car allowances required under contractual obligations. Approval of the Finance Committee shall be required for car allowances for any and all City Employees not covered by union contract".

An Ordinance in Amendment of Section 15-2 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence Entitled, Penalties for Traffic Violations, by Adding Sub-Section (c) to be Entitled, "Parking in Downtown Area of Providence after 6:00 o'clock P.M."

Be It Ordained By The City Of Providence:

Section 1. Section 15-2 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence is hereby amended by adding sub-section (c) which shall read as follows:

(c) Parking in downtown area of Providence after 6:00 P.M.

The Traffic Engineer is hereby directed to permit vehicles to park in downtown Providence at parking meters and other permitted parking spaces excluding fire lanes, fire hydrants, twenty-five feet to corner and designated emergency routes from 6:00 o'clock P.M. to 2:00 o'clock A.M., within the boundaries as set out and delineated as follows:

Beginning at a point at the intersection of Canal and Lonsdale Streets, running easterly along Lonsdale Street to its intersection with North Main Street; thence turning 90° more or less, and running southerly along North Main Street - South Main Street to the intersection of Planet Street and South Main Street; thence turning 90° more or less, running in a westerly direction along Planet Street to its intersection with the Access Road and Planet Street; thence turning 90° more or less, running in a southerly direction along said Access Road to its intersection with Interstate Route 95; thence turning 90° more or less, and running in a westerly direction along Interstate Route 95 to the intersection of Route 95; thence turning 90° and running in a northerly direction along said Interstate Route 95 to the Overpass of the Railroad Tracks; thence turning 90° more or less, and running in an easterly direction along said Railroad Tracks to the point and place of beginning.

Sec. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its Passage.
