

WHEREAS, Reverend Father Haik Donikian, Pastor of St. Sahag and St. Mesrob Armenian Apostolic Church, and its Parish Council President, Robert Yeremian, have informed the City Clerk, in writing, that the said Parish Council is concerned with the increased frequency of acts of vandalism being perpetrated in the vicinity of that Church, particularly on its parking lot, which is in close proximity to the Church, and

WHEREAS, acts of vandalism have occurred during Church sponsored events, which is a source of annoyance and costly, and

WHEREAS, the said Parish Council has attempted to assist in the prevention of such acts by hiring of Special Policemen to patrol the area during the times of Church functions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that as requested by the said Pastor and Parish Council President, the Commissioner of Public Safety is requested to authorize more frequent Police Patrols, in the immediate vicinity of St. Sahag and St. Mesrob Armenian Apostolic Church, particularly during evenings when Church functions are held, in an attempt to discourage future acts of vandalism against the property of the Church and its parishoners and visitors.

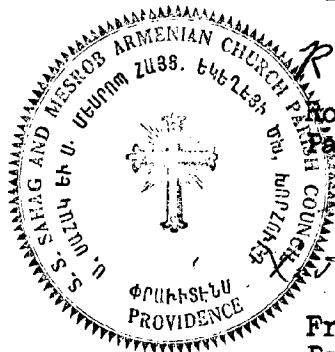
The Parish Council of our church is very much disturbed about the increasing frequency of acts of vandalism in the vicinity of our church and in the church parking lot.

Automobiles parked in the church parking lot during church sponsored events have had windows broken, antennas snapped off and in the most recent incident an automobile belonging to a visitor from Worcester was stolen while a meeting was in progress.

We realize that the Police Dept. is already severely taxed with problems of this type. The Parish Council has directed all church affiliated organizations to hire a special policeman to patrol the area whenever an evening function is being held.

It would be appreciated greatly if you would request the Police Dept. to provide more frequent patrols through this area during all evening functions in order to minimize the acts of vandalism cited above.




