June 2, 3, 4, 9, 10, 11, 16, 17, 18, 23, 24, 25, 30, 31,


July 1, 1982,

Dear Councilwoman:

Trinity Rep has received a grant of \$4,000 from the Mayor's Office of Community Development to make use of the park created by the City of Providence adjacent to the Lederer Theatre (Aborn Street between Washington and Fountain Streets). Our proposal is based on the presentation of lunchtime entertainments during the months of May and June, 1982.

We ask that, as our representative on the City Council, you might consider sponsoring a resolution on our behalf at the May 6 meeting to temporarily close the above-mentioned portion of Aborn Street on the following dates and times:

12 Noon to 2 p.m., Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays,
as follows:

May 11, 12, 13, 18, 19, 20, 25, 26, 27,
June 2, 3, 4, 9, 10, 11, 16, 17, 18, 23, 24, 25, 30, 31,
July 1, 1982

The two-hour period requested represents our plan to have one-half hour for setting up and clearing away at each end of a one-hour entertainment program. The one-hour program might include two presentations of the same event, each one lasting twenty to twenty-five minutes. In this way, we could double the audience that we hope to attract, expressly, the people who work and shop in Downtown Providence and those who live in such buildings as Beneficent House and the Regency complex.

If such a resolution is made and accepted by the Council, it is my understanding of Mr. Frank Tibaldi's position, as expressed to Pamela Messoré, that a simple wooden horse would be placed at each end of the street by our people and removed at the end of each program or in the event of any emergency requiring the passage of automobile traffic. We would erect approximately 50 chairs on a daily basis. All activity would take place on the stage and the brick area directly in front of it, leaving the roadway clear at all times.
