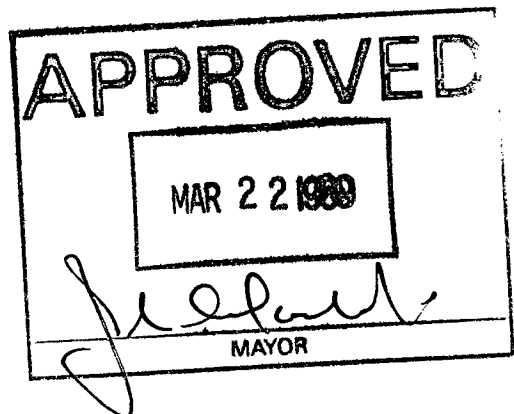

to direct that the following request for a change of street address be enacted:


The new Citizens Bank Building being constructed in Capital Center has been assigned an address of 25 Steeple Street.

Dear Councilwoman DiRuzzo:

In reference to the proposed resolutions changing 260 West Exchange Street to One West Exchange Center and 25 Steeple Street to One Citizens Plaza, I believe that these types of changes may tend to compromise the numbering system the City of Providence now maintains.

Presently, there are approximately 16 buildings in the downtown area that have been given out-of-sequence or unique addresses. Attached is a list of those locations. If we (jointly) allow this practice, an erratic address system in the City of Providence could occur which might result in chaotic conditions not only for the Postal Service, but for the City's Police and Fire Departments as well as others attempting to locate these addresses. I suggest your committee take these issues into consideration and review this resolution. Our recommendation is to retain the present address sequence.

I would like to express my appreciation for your notifying the Postal Service of the proposed resolutions for the city, and I hope our input is of assistance to you and the City Council in making a decision. If it would be beneficial, we would be more than willing to sit down to discuss this or any other address issues with you or members of your committee.

One LaSalle Plaza	is the advertised address of the new AT&T Building in Providence.
One LaSalle Square	is the Providence Civic Center (which is next door to the new AT&T Building).
