WHEREAS, Noise Pollution is a major problem affecting the quality of life in the City of Providence, not only the neighborhoods, but downtown as well, and

WHEREAS, This Noise Pollution is a clear violation of civilized residential living, noise pollution such as blaring music and car horns serving as door bells, and

WHEREAS, These are clearly violations of City laws which are seldom enforced, and

WHEREAS, It is only a minority of people who disrespect our neighborhoods, we must not allow them to drive the good, law abiding citizens out of Providence, and

WHEREAS, The longer it takes for noise pollution to rise toward the top of the list of police enforcement priorities, the longer it will take to revitalize our neighborhoods. All the shining, renovated and restored houses will not make a successful neighborhood if peace and quiet are not realities for its inhabitants,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That it is requested that the Police Department, out of the drug seizure account, purchase noise meters for all Community Police Officers and all Patrol Posts, so that enforcement of the Noise Ordinance can become a routine matter for our Police Officers.
