             ITIES AND TRANSIENT HOUSING STUDY WITHIN THE WEYBOSSET  
             HILL PROJECT

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE:

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Providence did on the 17th day of October, 1963, adopt Chapter 1575 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, which said Ordinance was duly approved October 18, 1963, and which said Ordinance is entitled: "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting the Official Redevelopment Plan for the Weybosset Hill Project No. R. I. R-7";and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance, among other things, makes findings and determinations that the Redevelopment Plan which is the subject of said Ordinance conforms to the general or master plan of the City of Providence as a whole and that said Plan will promote the public health, safety, morals and welfare of the City of Providence; and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance authorizes the Providence Redevelopment Agency to file with the United States of America an application or applications for financial assistance pursuant to Title I of the United States "Housing Act of 1949", as amended, to obtain funds to carry out the Plan; and

WHEREAS, the "Housing Act of 1949", as amended, provides that the redevelopment plan for any urban renewal area must be approved by the governing body of the locality in which the project is situated and that such approval includes, among other things, a finding that the redevelopment plan gives due consideration to the provision of adequate park and recreational areas and facilities, as may be desirable for neighborhood improvement, with special consideration to the health, safety and welfare of children residing in the general vicinity of the site covered by the plan; and

WHEREAS, the "Housing Act of 1949", as amended, provides that where the redevelopment plan for an urban renewal area permits the new construction of hotels or other housing for transient use there must be caused to be made a competent independent analysis of the local supply of hotel and other transient housing.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE:

1. That Chapter 1575 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, entitled "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting the Official Redevelopment Plan for Weybosset Hill Project No. R. I. R-7", approved October 18, 1963, be and the same is hereby amended by inserting the following after paragraph 13 and prior to paragraph 14 at page 12 thereof:

"13 a. It is further found and determined that the Official Redevelopment Plan for Weybosset Hill Project No. R. I. R-7 gives due consideration to the provision of adequate park and recreational areas and facilities, as may be desirable for neighborhood improvement, with special consideration for the health, safety and welfare of children residing in the general vicinity of the Weybosset Hill Project Area."

"13 b. That it is hereby found and determined, as a result of a competent independent analysis of the local supply of transient housing, which said analysis the Providence Redevelopment Agency has caused to be made, that there exists in the area a need for additional units of such housing."

2. That said Chapter 1575 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence be and the same is hereby ratified and affirmed in all other respects.

3. That this Ordinance shall take effect on its passage and shall be filed with the City Clerk who is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy thereof to the Providence Redevelopment Agency.

## CHAPTER 1590

### No. 98 AN ORDINANCE IN AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 187 OF THE 1948 ORDINANCE REGULATING FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS.

Approved February 21, 1964

#### Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. Paragraph A of Section 1 of Chapter 187 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence entitled "An Ordinance Regulating Food Dispensers, Restaurants and Other Establishments Preparing and Serving Food or Drink and Providing for a Permit for Same", Approved December 17, 1948, and being Sec.33 of Chapter 14 of the 1946 Ordinances, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

A. Restaurant. The term "restaurant" shall mean restaurant, coffee shop, cafeteria, lunch cart, delicatessen, caterer, ice cream parlor, cafe, bar, luncheonette, tavern, sandwich stand, soda fountain, short order cafe, grill, tearoom, cocktail lounge, nightclub, roadside stand, industrial-feeding establishment, private, public or non-profit organization or institution routinely serving food, catering kitchen, and all other eating or drinking establishments, as well as kitchens or other places in which food or drink is prepared for sale or service on the premises or served elsewhere.

Sec. 2. The first paragraph of Section 2 of said Chapter 187, as amended by Chapter 1515 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, Approved December 21, 1962, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 2. Licenses. The Bureau of Licenses shall issue licenses for all restaurants but only upon the written recommendation of the Superintendent of Health and shall collect the fees therefor. The annual fee for Class A Restaurants shall be Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars, for Class B Restaurants, Ten (\$10.00) Dollars, for Lunch Carts, Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, Restaurants operated by non-profit organizations in public, parochial or non-profit private schools or hospitals not operated for profit shall be required to obtain a license but shall be exempt from the payment of the fees therefore. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any victualling house or restaurant in the City of Providence without first having obtained a license for the conduct and operation of the same from the Bureau of Licenses and any such place which is operated without a license shall be closed forthwith by order of the Bureau of Licenses. Such licenses shall be posted in a conspicuous place on the premises."

Sec. 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and thereupon all Ordinances or parts or Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

### No. 99 AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SALE OF CIGARETTES AND TOBACCO PRODUCTS TO MINORS.

Approved February 21, 1964

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

SECTION 1. The owner, lessor, lessee, or custodian of any cigarette vending machine now or hereafter located in any place within the City for the purpose of dispensing cigarettes shall prominently display on the front thereof a copy of Chapter 11-9-13 and 11-9-14 in a type not less than <sup>twelve (12) point</sup> ~~12~~ type. *v.v.*

SECTION 2. The owner, lessor, lessee, operator, or any person selling cigarettes and tobacco products, shall prominently display or cause to be displayed in or upon the tobacco counter where cigarette or tobacco products are kept or sold or, if there be no counter at the place where such products are dispensed, a copy of Chapter 11-9-13 and 11-9-14 in a type not less than <sup>twelve (12) point</sup> ~~12~~ type. *v.v.*

SECTION 3. Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of the Ordinance shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Section 10 of Chapter 1 of the 1946 Ordinances, as amended.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall be effective upon its passage.

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

SECTION 1. Chapter 1565 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, as approved September 24, 1963 entitled: "An Ordinance Making Appropriation of \$44,468,244.36 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 1964", as amended, is hereby further amended by appropriating the sum of Thirty Four Thousand One Hundred Seventy Four (\$34,174) Dollars to Fire Department, Item 0 and Seven Thousand Four Hundred Seventy (\$7,470) Dollars to Fire Department, Item 2.

SECTION 2. The said sum of Forty One Thousand Six Hundred Forty Four (\$41,644) Dollars as thus added and appropriated shall be obtained by authorizing and directing the City Controller and City Treasurer to transfer a like amount from the Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures Account to the Receipt Account.

SECTION 3. The estimated receipts from the Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures Account are hereby increased by Forty One Thousand Six Hundred Forty Four (\$41,644) Dollars.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

Section 1. The following members of the Fire Department

shall be entitled to overtime and call back pay in accordance  
with the following provisions.

#### Sec. 2. OVERTIME

All hours worked in excess of ten (10) hours on any day tour,  
or fourteen (14) hours on any night tour, shall be compensated for  
at the overtime rate of pay hereinafter set forth; provided, however,  
that members of other divisions who normally work shorter tours shall  
be compensated for hours worked in excess of a normal tour at an over-  
time rate of pay as hereinafter set forth; and provided further that  
overtime shall not be paid where men are held over at a fire already  
in progress while waiting for relief.

#### Sec. 3. CALL BACK PAY

Employees called back for multiple alarms shall be compensated  
for at least four (4) hours, in the event the overtime actually  
worked is less than four (4) hours, at the overtime rate of pay  
hereinafter set forth.

#### Sec. 4. OVERTIME RATE OF PAY

The hourly rate of overtime pay shall be equal to one fifty-

Section 1. The last paragraph of Section 43.1 of Article III  
of Chapter 2 of the 1946 Revised Ordinances, as amended, is hereby  
further amended to read as follows: Subsequent to his first full  
year of service, each fireman shall be entitled to receive seventy-  
five dollars each year; provided, however, that each fireman regular-  
ly required to wear dress uniform during his hours of duty shall be  
entitled to receive one hundred five dollars each year. Said sums  
shall be paid at such times and upon such terms and conditions as may  
be prescribed by rule or regulation adopted by Commissioner of  
Public Safety and approved by the City Controller.

Sec. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect as of October 1, 1963.
