An Ordinance in Amendment of and in Addition to Chapter 1044 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, Approved July 12, 1956, and entitled "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting the Official Redevelopment Plan for the West River Project No. UR R.I. 1-6" for the Revision of Disposition of Silver Spring Industrial Park.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

1. That Chapter 1044 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence approved July 12, 1956 and entitled "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting the Official Redevelopment Plan for the West River Project No. UR R.I. 1-6" as Amended by Chapter 1142 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, approved September 6, 1957, as Amended by Chapter 1191 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, approved March 21, 1958, as Amended by Chapter 1366 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, approved October 7, 1960, as Amended by Chapter 1666 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, approved December 4,

1964, as Amended by Chapter 1972-45 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, approved September 11, 1972 and as Amended by Chapter 1974-10 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, approved March 22, 1974, as Amended by Chapter 1984-11 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, approved February 10, 1984 and as Amended by Chapter 1987-7 of the Ordinance, approved March 11, 1987, be and the same is further Amended as follows:

A. The title "Permitted Uses for the Expanded Project Area except Parcel 3B as shown on Map B "Proposed Acquisition and Disposition." for paragraph b. under Chapter B, Section 4 entitled "Regulations and Controls to be Applied" in Page 10 of the Official Redevelopment Plan which is part of the aforesaid Ordinance be deleted and substitute the following title:

b. Permitted Uses for the Expanded Project Area except Parcels 1, 2 and 3B as shown on Map B "Proposed Acquisition and Disposition."

B. Paragraph "c" under Chapter B, Section 4 entitled "Regulations and Controls to be Applied" in Page 10 of the Official Redevelopment Plan which is part of the aforementioned Ordinance be deleted and substitute the following paragraph "c".

c. For Parcels 1, 2 and 3B as shown on Map B "proposed Acquisition and Disposition" C-2 General Commercial uses and C-1 Limited Commercial uses of the City of Providence Zoning Ordinance shall be the only uses permitted. All C-2 uses and C-1 uses shall be subject to the same limitations and controls as to use as specifically set forth in the C-2 Zone and C-1 Zone respectively.

C. Delete Map B "Proposed Acquisition and Disposition" dated July, 1983, and revised May, 1986 as contained in the Official Redevelopment Plan as amended by Chapter 1987-7, approved March 11, 1987 and insert Map B entitled "Proposed Acquisition and Disposition" revised September, 1988 in its stead.

2. That said Chapter 1044 of the Ordinance of

the City of Providence as adopted and as heretofore amended, be and the same is hereby ratified and affirmed in all other aspects.

3. That this Ordinance shall take effect on its passage and shall be filed with the City Clerk who is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy therefore to the Providence Redevelopment Agency.

Ordered, That after the entry of this order or decree, the City Clerk shall cause a notice thereof to be published in a newspaper published in the County of Providence at least once each week for three successive weeks and a further and personal notice shall be served by the City Sergeant upon every owner of land abutting the above-named highway which has been abandoned, who is known to reside within this State.

Resolved, That the following named person, firm or corporation is hereby granted permission to erect, alter or use a building or structure at the location named herein for the sale of petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil and their products, compounds and components as described and shown in and on application therefor and accompanying plat, all on file in the office of the Department of Inspection and Standards subject to the conditions that said person, firm or corporation shall not violate any of the laws of the State of Rhode Island or any of the Ordinances of the City of Providence relative to the erection, use or occupation of said structure and that said person, firm or corporation shall not allow petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil or their products, compounds or components, to be conveyed over or across any sidewalk by means of any pipe or hose, and upon such special conditions as are hereby enumerated and further provided that the Director of the Department of Inspection and Standards may authorize minor changes in the structural detail of plans on file, viz:

Shell Oil Company, 691 North Main Street, Plat 8, Lots 5 and 397, install two (2) additional multi-product dispensers, making a total of eight (8) multi-product dispensers and twenty-four (24) hoses on the premises.

The erection or location of any buildings or structures not shown on the original plat on file with the Director of the Department of Inspection and Standards, or any change in the location of buildings or structures from that shown on said plat shall be deemed a violation of this permit.

Resolution granting permission to Outlet Communications, Inc. to cause the installation of three flagpoles in front of their main entrance along 111 Dorrance Street.
