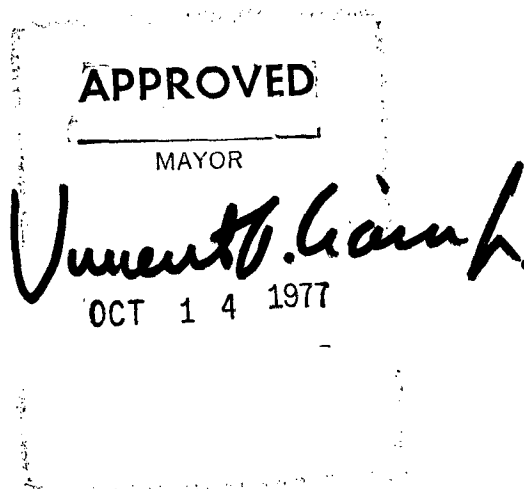

This department has received the following resolution and has taken the subsequent action:

Request: That the Traffic Engineer be and he is hereby requested to consider permitting non-payment of parking at all meters within Downtown Providence Shopping Area during the Christmas Season, from the day following Thanksgiving, same being November 25, 1977 to and including December 31, 1977, from 10AM to 9PM.

Disposition: It is this department's opinion that very little parking space will be gained by non-enforcement of the parking meters in the Downtown Business District. However, if the administration feels they would like to experiment with it, we would suggest that the meters not be enforced between 11AM and 6PM.
