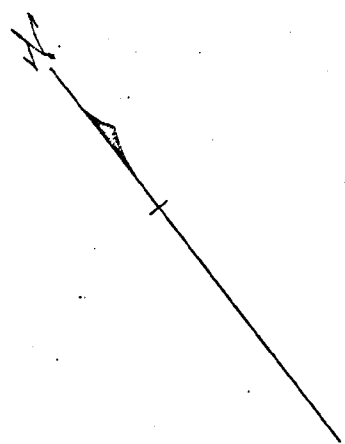

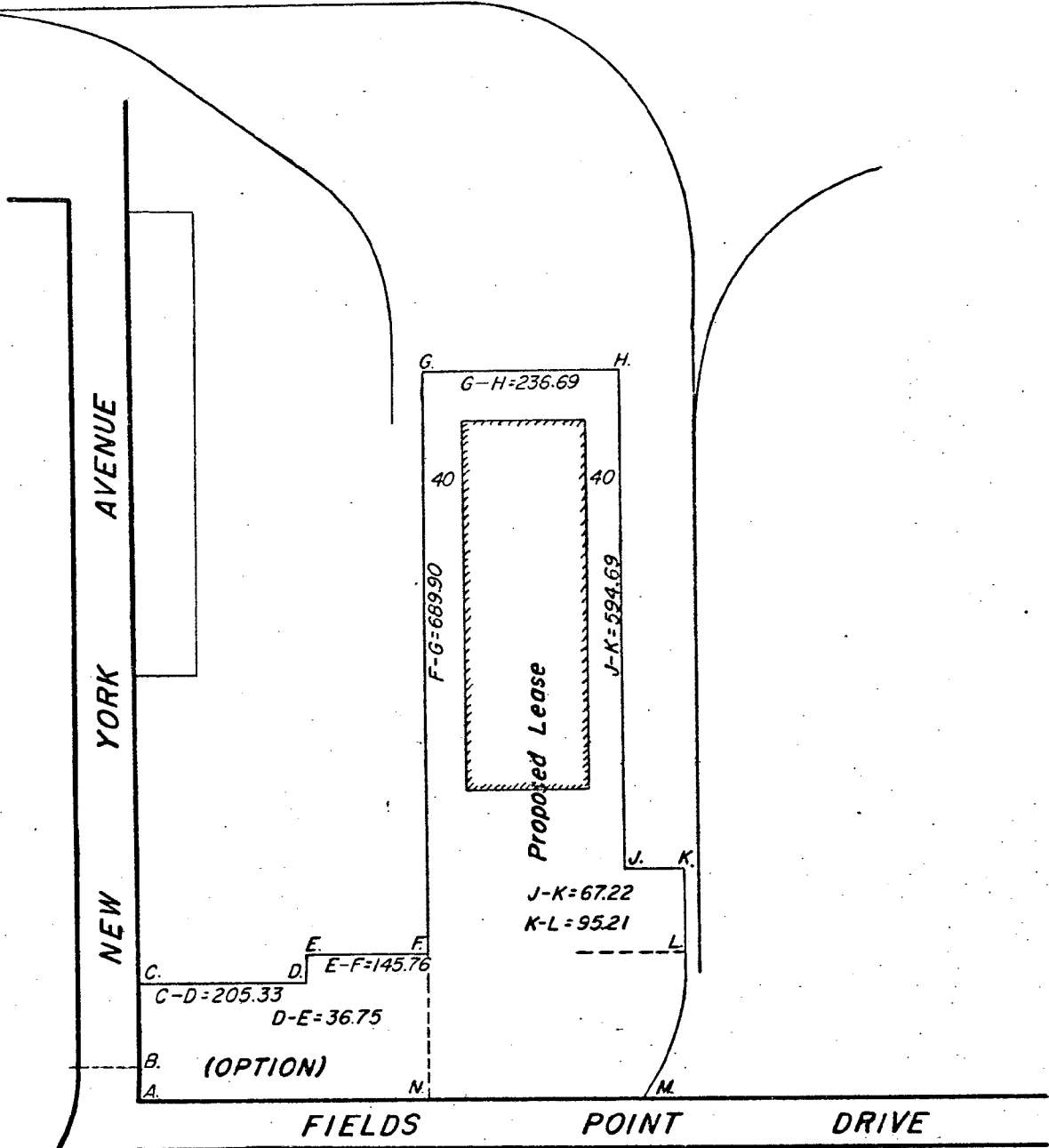

We pause tonight to honor the memory of Everett McKinley Dirksen statesman, patriot, public servant, and American citizen.

Senator Dirksen served his constituents of the State of Illinois with uncommon devotion and skill, and while in Washington, enjoyed the reputation for fairness and compassion in his dealings with friend and foe. Gifted with a sense of humor -- that saving grace in this rough and tumble game of politics -- he relished the well turned phrase, the subtle innuendo, and held the attention of all when he rose to speak on the floor of the Senate. Younger and less well-informed colleagues were indebted to him for his wise counsel and guidance. He was honored by the Republican members of the Senate by election to the highest office the members of that august body had the power to bestow. Quick in repartee, forthright in principle, and with complete candor in debate, he doggedly held to his personal conviction of the greatness and destiny of America. History will recall the active role he played in forging American policy and ideology in the international arena.

We pay tribute to Everett McKinley Dirksen, a man beloved by all, because this world is a better place for his having lived in it, and because he served his fellow man to the best of his ability.





ending March 1971.






