

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 409

Approved July 27, 2018

WHEREAS, St. Pius V Parish was formally established by Rt. Rev. Matthew Harkins, bishop of Providence, for the spiritual needs of Catholics living in the area surrounding the newly established Providence College campus; and

WHEREAS, The parish was established and Friar Albert Casey, the organizing pastor, was appointed pastor by letter on October 16, 1918; and

WHEREAS, St. Pius V began celebrating Mass on the first floor of Harkins Hall on the Providence College Campus on October 27, 1918; and

WHEREAS, Harkins Hall continued to serve as the parish church until a combination church-school building was constructed on Elmhurst Avenue a decade later; and

WHEREAS, St. Pius School officially opened in September of 1929 and the Sisters of St. Dominic of Blauvelt, New York, were welcomed as administrators and teachers in the school; and

WHEREAS, In 1956, Rev. Kenneth Sullivan, O.P. became the new pastor and led a campaign to construct a new church on the corner of Roselyn Avenue and Eaton Street, where it continues to stand to this day; and

WHEREAS, The parish has been an integral part of the Elmhurst neighborhood and surrounding community; and

WHEREAS, It is a fitting tribute to St. Pius V Parish to name the part of Elmhurst Avenue between Fair Oaks Ave and Eaton Street in the Elmhurst neighborhood in honor of its Centennial.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the City Council of the City of Providence does hereby recognize and celebrate St. Pius V Parish on their Centennial.





On Camp St. I responded to Matt Shumate previously as follows:

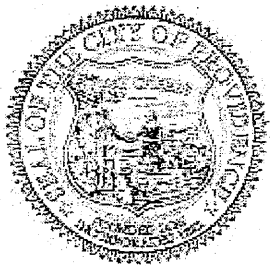
"I assume the renaming is for the entire length of Camp St. I suggest installing ceremonial streetname signs at its intersection with Olney, Doyle and Rochambeau." The sign would be a tall streetname sign indicating Camp St. as the street name with "Philip Addison Jr. Way" on the top border

For St. Pius V. School I recommend installing a ceremonial streetname sign at the Fair Oaks Ave./Eaton St. intersection. The sign would be a tall streetname sign indicating Fair Oaks Ave. as the street name with "St. Pius V Way" on the top border"
